WASHINGTON, July 2 .- The monthly circulation statement issued by the controller of the currency shows that at the close of the fiscal year, June 29, 1901, the total circulation of bank notes was \$353,-742,187, an increase for the year of \$44,-

The circulation, based on United States bonds, was \$323,809,684, an increase for the year of \$49,775,134, and an increase for the month of \$352,507. The circulation secured by lawful money amounted to \$29,851,505, a de-

crease for the year of \$5,673,380, and an increase for the month of \$1,807,130. The amount of United States registered bonds on deposit to secure circulation
