PHILIPPINES' NEW TARIFF FRAMED

The War Department Fixes Duties on Philippine Imports—Advantageous to United States Goods.

NEW YORK, July 8.—The new Philippine tariff has received its finishing touches at the war department, the Washington correspondent of the Tribune reports, and it will be sent to Governor Taft in a day or two. It is expected it will be promulgated early next month to go into effect immediately. An important provision affecting goods in transit has been included, permitting consignees to declare all imports which shall arrive in the Philippines within 60 days after the tariff is put into operation either under the old schedules now in use or under the new duties. After that period the old military customs revenue law, founded upon Spanish law, will forever cease, and the new system, designed especially to promote United States trade, will take its place.

The new law is expected to produce annually \$15,000,000 revenue for the support of the insular government and to reduce materially imports from all countries except the United States and Spain, particular attention having been given to the incidental protection of Philippine industries against rivals in the Western Pacific and Indian Ocean. The government at Washington and the commission at Manila have been working on the new tariff since last August, and now that full agreement has been reached, it is expected that congress at its new session will approve the schedules without modification and put them into the statutes.

Camping Near La Grande.

LA GRANDE, July 8.—The Eastern Oregon independent brigade, O. N. G. is in camp, at Camp Summers, about two and a half miles east of La Grande, and about half a mile from Island City. It is not the best place in the world for a military camp, so far as bodily comfort is concerned, but as a business proposition, it is a success. It is not a pleasure resort, but their is ample room for drill, and the soldier boys are given all they want to do. It is all right as a military school, and that is evidently what Major Mead had in mind when he selected the site for the camp.

Major Mead who is in command of the brigade says the boys are doing nicely. The following is the roster of officers:

Major F. A. Mead, commanding; Captain F. C. Brosius, surgeon; Lieutenant W. J. Church, adjutant; Lieutenant E. P. Mahaffey, quartermaster; Lieutenant A. A. Kelier, inspector rifle practice; Lieutenant W. E. Bowers, commissary.

The following companies are encamped on the grounds.

Company A, Captain Sam White, Baker City; company B, Captain A. C. Williams, La Grande; company D, Captain G. E. Bartell, The Dalles. Sumpster cavalry troop, Captain T. K. Muir.

The cavalry troop was due in camp Saturday evening, but the march was longer and harder than anticipated, owing to the circuitous route the troops had to take, and La Grande was not reached until 1:30 yesterday afternoon. The troops came in with Colonel Jackson, inspector general, riding at the head, with Captain Muir, in command.

The troops will remain until Thursday noon, when they will break camp and return home.

Camp Summers was named in honor of General Summers, of the Second Oregon. Colonel Jackson's ride from Sumpster is rather remarkable for a man of 67 years of age, but he stood it quite as well as many who are from 25 to 30 years of age.

Great Steel Strike to be Settled. NEW YORK, July 8.—The World says: A plan has been agreed upon which will settle the great steel strike within the next five days. As matters stand all that remains to be done is to hold a final meeting to ratify the plan formally and announce its terms. The programme now is to hold that meeting and make that announcement Wednesday or Thursday of this week in New York or Pittsburg.

The main points at issue have been settled, and there will be no great steel strike, such as was contemplated a week ago. It may be stated that this early settlement is the direct result of J. P. Morgan's efforts. If the conference which is formally to end the strike is held here, it will be at the office of Mr. Morgan; if in Pittsburg, at the office of the American Tinplate Company. Representatives of the general board of the United States Steel Company; all the subsidiary companies whose interests are affected as well as the leaders of the various labor bodies in the Amalgamated Association, were notified Saturday night of the coming conference, and were invited to send representatives.

Charles M. Schwarz, president of the United States Steel Company, who is at Manhattan Beach, declines to discuss the strike. He was asked:

"Will you see Mr. Morgan tomorrow to discuss the terms for ending the strike?"

"Oh, I don't know about that; I see Mr. Morgan every day, and we discuss many things."

Practices of Beguny Sect. NEW YORK, July 8.—A dispatch to the World from St. Petersburg says:

Twenty peasants, 12 of them women, have been arrested and imprisoned in the Province of Bessarabia and Kherson for having been implicated in a new outbreak of Beguny atrocities. The Beguny is a strange sect which kill many of its votaries, the victims willingly consenting to the sacrifice. The favorite method is to bury alive those selected for the sacrifice. In the cases just discovered the victims were given a more merciful death. Some of the women arrested confessed of having smothered members of their families with willows. The Beguny has existed for nearly 30 years. Though its followers are religious fanatics, the Beguny was originally a political and economical organization, its agitators having always been directed toward greater personal liberty and political
