### STAGES ROBBED IN CALIFORNIA

Job Performed by a Lone Highwayman—He Held Up Eighteen People.

UKIAH, Cal., July 16.—The Potter Valley & Blue Lake stages were held up eight miles north of this city this afternoon, by a lone highwayman, who lined up the eighteen passengers and secured about \$400.

The two stages left this city on schedule time. The road to Potter Valley diverges from the road to Blue Lake about five miles north of Ukiah, and it was just before they reached the forks that the highwayman, masked with a handkerchief, sprang into the road in front of the first vehicle and ordered the driver to stop. The robber then ordered the passengers, eighteen in number, to alight and line up. They were all tourists on their way to the surrounding resorts, and they complied with exceeding promptness. About \$400 was deposited in a nice little pile on the roadside, and the drivers ordered to drive on, and the passengers warned not to look back. One of the passengers, who had \$200 in gold in his pocket, dropped the coin in the dust while the attention of the robber was distracted, and covered it up with dust. He went to Potter and then returned to hunt for his money.

Drive Out Beet Sugar.

DENVER, July 16.—Henry T. Oxnard, the well-known promoter of the beet sugar industry, who is in the city, declared that the recent reduction in sugar prices is the beginning of an effort by the sugar trust to drive beet sugar out of the market. Said he:

"The question to be decided is whether the sugar trust or the beet people shall stay in the field. We have noticed that the trust will no longer sell our product, and prices are going down in anticipation of the beet sugar which will soon be upon the market."

Good Rain in Kansas. KANSAS CITY, July 16.—Rain fell over an area of 80 miles around Kansas City early this morning and reports from different parts of the southwest indicate thunder storms and lower temperature during the day or tonight.

At Lawrence, Kan., this morning enough rain fell to lay the dust, but not enough to do any practical good. At Ottawa and Wellsville, in the next county west from Lawrence, about half an inch of rain fell.

At Wellsville there had been no rain for more than three months and some fields are now too far gone to be revived.

Over an inch of rain is reported at Toronto, Kan., two counties further west. There was a fairly good shower in Kansas City early this morning, but at 11 o'clock the sky was cloudless and the weather bureau reported a temperature of 93. A good rain fell at Camden Point, Mo., three counties east of Kansas City, and it will result in much good to the corn, which in that vicinity is still a dark green.

Miami County, Kan., two counties south from Kansas City, experienced a good rain last night, the first since April 13. It came too late to benefit the early crops.

Bold Bank Burglars.

COLUMBUS, July 16.—A gang of six or seven robbers wrecked the Resler & Ashbrooke bank at Alexandria, in Licking County, about 1 o'clock this morning. The strong box resisted their efforts and they overlooked a package of \$1500 in the outer vault, which they blew almost to pieces. Four charges of dynamite were exploded to open the vault.

The noise aroused citizens, who surrounded the building, but the robbers remained in the bank for an hour, making repeated attempts to force the strong box meanwhile keeping up an exchange of shots with the villagers. Finally the bandits fled in two rigs which had been previously stolen.

There was only \$800 in the strong box, the package of \$1500 having been relieved too late to be placed therein last evening. The loss is covered by insurance.

New Water system for Baker City.

BAKER CITY, July 17.—The new water system of this city, bringing a distance of eight miles, water from Elk creek, a fine mountain stream, is nearing completion, and it is now expected that the present scarcity of water will be eliminated by the end of the present month. When
