## SCORCHING HEAT IN SOUTHWEST

May Eclipse Records of Last Week—  
Forty Deaths Occurred in St. Louis  
From Heat During Twenty-four Hours.

KANSAS CITY, July 24.—A scorching heat wave is prevalent over the Southwest today, with conditions that make it possible that the unprecedented high temperature records of the past week will be eclipsed. In Kansas City at 1 o'clock the weather bureau reports 105 degrees, the highest ever recorded here so early in the day. Similar conditions prevail throughout the state. The temperature here last night averaged 90, and the atmosphere was extremely heavy. Sleep was almost out of the question and the suffering was great. Today locally there is hardly a breath of air stirring, and there is no rain in sight. The only rain for the past 24 hours in Missouri or Kansas is reported from Hays, Kan., near the center of the state, where a light shower fell.

Twenty-five prostrations were reported up to 1 p. m.

Forty Deaths in St. Louis.

St. Louis, July 24.—Twenty-two deaths due directly to the heat were reported in St. Louis yesterday. In several of these cases, death occurred late Monday, and was not made public through the ordinary channels until yesterday. Thermic fever, sunstroke, heat prostration and insolation are named as the various forms of the fatal stroke. The number of prostrations reported up to 2 o'clock this morning is 55. These records for prostrations and deaths were never equaled in one day in the history of St. Louis.

Physicians at the City Hospital passed a hard day and night, cases arriving constantly and taxing the resources of the building to the utmost. Until a late hour last night fresh cases constantly arrived, and the medical staff was worked to the point of exhaustion. The heat in St. Louis yesterday was of the record-breaking sort, the government observation office mercury registered 106 in the shade at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. This was one degree short of Monday's maximum—107 degrees—which is the highest ever recorded in this vicinity.

The temperature at noon today was 102, two degrees higher than yesterday at the same time. Up to noon the reports received in the mortuary office show 40 deaths from heat during the past 24 hours. The wards of the City Hospital are full of heat patients. During the past 24 hours 38 cases have been treated. Ten cases were received this afternoon. The actual number of prostrations is much greater, but cannot be learned, as many are treated at their homes.

At 2 p. m. 106 and a fraction was the official record, and the temperature was still rising. The Transit Company has offered to let poor children under 10 years of age ride free to the parks during the period of excessive heat.

### Famous Outlaws Located.

DENVER, Colo., July 24.—The persons alleged to be members of the Bender family, for whom, according to a dispatch from Topeka, Governor Stanley of Kansas has issued requisition papers on Gov. Orman of Colorado, are Mrs. Frank Ayers and her mother, known as Mrs. Reed in Fort Collins, where they reside, and Will Baker, of Longmont. Mrs. Ayers was formerly the wife of Charles Lamont, who is serving a 14 year term in prison for criminal assault. After she secured a divorce from Lamont she married Frank Ayers, and they lived on adjoining ranches near Manhattan, a mining camp 40 miles from Fort Collins. Two years ago a family from Kansas named Maddox, going through that portion of Colorado in prairie schooners, camped at Ayers' place. Mrs. Maddox is said to have exclaimed on coming face to face with Mrs. Ayers.

"Why, you're Kate Bender." The explanation was made in the presence of Ayers, who later went to Kansas, disguised himself as a woman, so that his wife could not trace him, and at Cherryvale told the officers of his suspicions regarding his wife's family. He declares that Mrs. Reed is in reality Mrs. Bender and that she was separated from her husband, who is living in Utah, and that Will Baker is young Bender.

Mrs. Ayers denies that she is Kate Bender, and declares that she will prove an alibi. She is about 50 years old. Governor Orman is out of the city, but his private secretary says that the requisition papers mentioned in the Topeka dispatch have not yet been received.

### Alleged to Have Stolen Horses.

OREGON CITY, July 24.—David McKelvey, who arrived at Damascus yesterday afternoon with a drove of 32 horses from Eastern Oregon, was arrested by constable Jackson, of The Dalles, and taken to Wasco County on a warrant charging him with the larceny of eight horses. Constable Moody, who assisted The Dalles officer in locating McKelvey last night, stated that none of the horses in the band were identified as those alleged to have been stolen.


