From the statement of the fair committee published in The Chronicle, the business men of The Dalles refuse to take hold of the matter and subscribe the necessary funds to carry out the enterprise. In this we think they are acting very foolish, as what little each would be out would amount to nothing compared to the money left in their towns. But then it is possible more than can be expected of the place, as those who have watched the course of events in the past have observed that time and again by parsimonious they have driven enterprises away that by a few dollars judiciously invested or a helping hand extended would have brought business and capital into their town.
