along Main street were elosed sll day.
The very quiet, and but few men spent the
day on the sidewaike, as bas been the
plan in the past. The fight for Sunday closing came up
a few weeks ago by a petition from a number of farmers asking to have the
saloons closed to keep employes sober and fit for work. The ealoons refused at
firrt and then proclaimed an intention of
forcing every forcing every house to close. The oflicere
tried to secure peaceable compliance, but failed, and then three saloons held
out alone to test the law. Ail three proprietors were arrested and found
guilty. Then a week ago they held open
again and were arreated by again and were arrested by information
in the superior court. The cases will come up at the next jury term. Baving
been convicted in the juatice court, the saloon men appealed to the saperior
court and loat. An announcement that any farther violations would be vigor-
ouely prosecuted has had the effect of closing the
history.
