

Important Tax Sale.

Section III of the law says:

On the first Monday after July 1, 1901, the sheriff of every county in this state in which lands have been heretofore bid in for taxes by such county, or any public corporation therein and to which they shall have acquired title as hereinbefore provided, shall proceed to sell such lands to the highest bidder for eash, in manner and form as upon sale under execution.
