

AVERAGE YIELDS OF WHEAT.

From the horticultural department issues a statement of average yields of wheat in the three northwest states during ten years past. The report shows:

Average yield per acre in Oregon during 10 year period, 17.7 bushels; Washington, 20.8; Idaho, 22.8.

These figures are somewhat significant and are susceptible of some study, says the E. O. Why should the average yield in Oregon be the lowest of the three states? The soil in the eastern half on which wheat is raised is of volcanic ash, the best for the production of grain that has ever been found. And the yield in the eastern half is much greater on the average than 17.7. There is only one explanation that offers itself and that is that the average has been reduced by the deterioration of Willamette valley wheat lands. It is commonly known that wheat lands in Western Oregon have produced of late years much less than they did when the soil was virgin. And so true has this been that farmers have begun to abandon the culture of wheat in that region.

The state of Washington is younger, while the state of Idaho is the youngest of the three. According to the age and in inverse ratio as to age the average yields run.

Volunteer crops furnish a partial solution, but not a sufficient solution. The deteriorated Willamette valley lands account for Oregon's ranking third on the north coast.
