SEWER NOTICE.

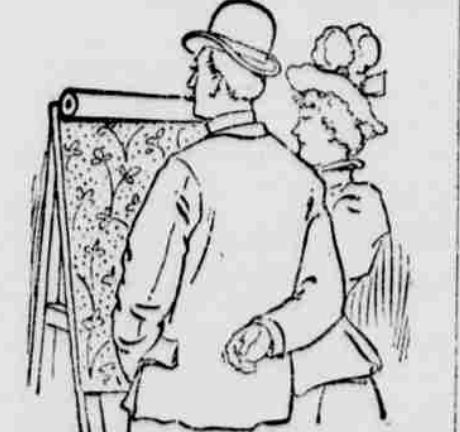
