LOOKS BAD

FOR TRUST

General Strike Order Affects New Line of Products—Skilled Union Men Have Had Many Prosperous Years.

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—The Iron Age, discussing the effects of the strike, says: The calling out of the union men in all the plants of the United States Steel Corporation thus far not affected, will considerably extend the trouble and will affect a fresh line of products. So far as the Illinois Steel Company is concerned, it may be noted that the Joliet and Milwaukee plants are strictly union. The former turn out steel billets, wire rods, strikers, splice bars, track bolts, and some sizes of steel bars. The Milwaukee works largely makes steel bars, agricultural shapes and a large quantity of steel rails. Of the South Chicago works, the union is supposed to control the Bessemer and rail shops, and the operatives of the plate mill are non-union.

The Shenango plant of the National Steel Company at Newcastle has already closed down, and the Mingo Junction plant of the same company is also rated union. The National Tube Company counts among its mills as union the Franktown and the Republic Iron Works, both chiefly engaged in making skelp, and the Riverside works at Benwood, near Wheeling, an important tube plant. It will be observed, therefore, that additional capacity will be cut off in steel bars; that some important steel plants may be shut down; that a remarkable capacity for producing track material will be stopped; and that there may be some embarrassment about an adequate amount of skelp and of tubes. The wire, structural and plate trades are not affected. In anticipation of possible trouble at South Chicago, the plant at Youngstown has been fitted up to make rails.

So far as the mills already affected by the strike are concerned, the manufacturers have made some gains. The position of the manufacturers is an exceedingly strong one, backed as it is by an underwritten syndicate, which has thus far called 12 1/2 per cent of \$2,000,000.

All Shipping Tied Up.
SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 8.—Although the municipal league has not abandoned its attempt to have the labor troubles in this city settled by a compromise, both sides are preparing for a protracted struggle. The labor leaders are holding almost continuous sessions for the purpose of getting their forces in readiness to meet every move of the situation, and the employers are bending every energy to get men to take the places vacated by the strikers. The tie-up of shipping is becoming serious. There are at least ninety coasters and twenty deep-water vessels at anchor in the bay. Some of these cannot be unloaded, and others cannot be loaded under existing conditions. The Sand Teamsters' Union has decided to call out all men, not excepting those employed by the street-cleaning contractors, who had been accepted in the strike of the labor council.

Murdered Four Years Ago.
SEATTLE, Aug. 7.—While grading near South Seattle yesterday, workmen unearthed a small trunk, which, on examination, was found to contain the remains of a young girl. Coroner Hoye was notified, but for some reason did not report his findings until today. According to the Coroner the girl had been murdered, a bullet hole being found in the skull, and the body cut to pieces and placed in the trunk. The Coroner says the body must have been buried at least four years.

Rumors of Plot to Assassinate Edward
NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—Says the London correspondent of the Tribune: Rumors are current that the reason why the departure from London for Germany of King Edward and other royal mourners has been delayed was that the German police authorities had received information of a plot which the anarchists had intended to put into execution at Friedrichshof. It is certainly somewhat significant that even now the exact hour of the king's departure has not been made known. However, it is known that preparations for his departure are complete. Accompanied by Queen Alexandra and Princess Victoria he will leave London tomorrow evening and reach Cronberg in time to be present at the memorial service which is to be held there Sunday.
