## NO REST IN AMERICA.

Machinery in the United States is Not Permitted to Last Until Out of Date.

An experienced railroad man has the following to say regarding English railway methods, says Victor Smith in the New York Press. "It is singular, to say the least, that the English railway managers have just discovered that American locomotives consume more coal, use more oil and require more repairs than those of their home make. If this is a fact, it could have been demonstrated in a trial lasting a month. Over here we wouldn't accept an English locomotive as a gift. It would be regarded as an enormous monument. I fear that the British are beginning to feel a trade sure over America's commercial invasion of all the markets of the world, and the Missouri railway people are trying to knock us on our locomotives."

Continuing, the official said: "The chairman of the Missouri road, an impressive statement, namely: 'We tend our engines carefully, we clean them and do everything to make them last.' In this country we rest nothing, not even ourselves. Bishop Cumberland's familiar saying, 'It is better to wear out than to rust out' has taken hold of us body and soul and breeches. The Englishman rests his hats, shoes, trousers, coats, harness, carriages and whatever else he may own, and he is not ashamed. A few advanced Americans have recently adopted the practice of 'washing' their shoes for a rest, and the result is longer wear without losing shape. Some of our locomotives are never allowed to cool from the heat of one day to another. I have wonder they do not live to be chinned among the antiquaries."

## YOUR BODY NOT YOUR OWN.

If You Are So Disposed You Cannot Bequeath Your Corpse to the Doctors.

The supreme court of California has decided in a contest between next of kin on the one hand and claimants under a will on the other for the possession of a corpse, that a man cannot by will dispose of that which after his death will be his corpse, says the Chicago Chronicle. The custody of the corpse belongs to the next of kin in preference to the administrator. This view is based on the fact that the general English and American legal authorities establish the rule that, in the absence of statutory provisions, there is no property in a dead body.

If this rule is correct, the sooner statutory provisions are obtained enabling a man who feels that a great benefit to humanity will accrue through increase of medical knowledge by the continuance post mortem of an investigation into his case or that new light may be shed upon other scientific problems, to authorize by will such use of his corpse, the better.

This Southern Gentleman Destroyed One of the Finest Vineyards in the South.

**SEWER NOTICE.**  
Notice is hereby given that the common council of Dalles City, at a meeting thereof held on Saturday, the 3d day of August, 1901, determined to construct and relay a drain and sewer described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point where the center line of Court street intersects the projection of the south line of the first alley south of Fifth street in said Dalles City, and running thence in a northerly direction along, or near, the center line of said Court street and along the line of the old sewer now located in said street, to a point where the center line of said Court street intersects the projection of the center line of the alley between Main and Second streets, in said city; thence westerly to said alley and along the center line thereof and a continuation thereof to the west line of Union street; thence in a northwesterly direction, along the most practicable route, to low water in Mill creek. Said council also at the same time determined that the cost of the construction and relaying of said drain and sewer should be assessed against the property benefited thereby, and declared the present sewer and drain now in existence upon and along the line above described to be in a dangerous condition, and further provided that notice be given of the construction and relaying of said drain and sewer by publication of a notice for two weeks in The Dalles Daily Chronicle, the first publication thereof to be made on Monday the 5th day of August, 1901, and final publication thereof to be on Monday the 19th day of August, 1901, and further determined that said drain and sewer be constructed and relaid above mentioned immediately after the expiration of the time mentioned in said notice.

All persons interested are hereby notified that said drain and sewer will be constructed and relaid as above determined and provided for.
