IN FAR-OFF LABRADOR.

For Hunters in That Country Who Have Just Heard of the Death of Queen Victoria.

Reports are reaching civilization of the operations of the past winter in the interior and upon the coast of Labrador. The season was generally speaking a mild one, and the fatalities among the Indians fewer than usual, a good supply of furs was secured, but none of such peculiar value as some of those taken during the preceding winter, says the New York Sun.

The highest price paid for a single skin of last winter's catch was \$300, which was for a black silver fox, the king of all the fur-bearing animals of Labrador. Exactly double that amount was paid for a skin of the same quality, a very noble specimen, about a year ago. Prices in general are scarcely so good as present as they were this time last year.

Marten skins, which have brought as much as \$25 a skin, sold this spring for from \$15 to \$18. Traders are especially proud of the others, and minks which they obtain from Labrador, which have fur of a peculiar fineness and luster.

The hunters from the interior of Labrador had not heard of the death of Queen Victoria until they emerged from the woods a few days ago. No mail matter can reach them during the winter. Even the residents along the coast had only six mails from autumn till spring, and these had to be conveyed over the snow by dogs, on sleighs, or wags of proper dogs and other means of conveyance.

SEWER NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that the common council of Dalles City, at a meeting thereof held on Saturday, the 3d day of August, 1901, determined to construct and relay a drain and sewer described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point where the center line of Court street intersects the projection of the south line of the first alley south of Fifth street in said Dalles City, and running thence in a northerly direction along or near the center line of said Court street and along the line of the old sewer now located in said street, to a point where the center line of said Court street intersects the projection of the center line of the alley between Main and Second streets, in said city; thence westerly to said alley and along the center line thereof and a continuation thereof to the west line of Union street; thence in a northwesterly direction, along the most practicable route, to low water in Mill creek. Said council also at the same time determined that the cost of the construction and relaying of said drain and sewer should be assessed against the property benefited thereby, and declared the present sewer and drain now in existence upon and along the line above described to be in a dangerous condition, and further provided that notice be given of the construction and relaying of said drain and sewer by publication of a notice for two weeks in The Dalles Daily Chronicle, the first publication thereof to be made on Monday the 5th day of August, 1901, and final publication thereof to be on Monday the 19th day of August, 1901, and further determined that said drain and sewer be constructed and relaid as above mentioned immediately after the expiration of the time mentioned in said notice.

All persons interested are hereby notified that said drain and sewer will be constructed and relaid as above determined and provided for.
