BRYAN NOT MENTIONED

Boy Orator Ignored by Pennsylvania Democrats—They Will Make Campaign Entirely on State Issues.

HARRISBURG, Pa., Aug. 15.—The campaign for the ticket nominated today by the Democratic convention will be entirely on state issues. No mention is made in the platform of the name of W. J. Bryan, or free silver, imperialism and other national issues. The last legislature is condemned for the passage of rapid transit and "ripper" bills, and pronounced the most corrupt legislative body that ever convened in this country. All friends of good government are invited to join with the Democracy in its effort to "save the state the further dishonor."

The platform is one of the most remarkable declarations of principles ever issued by a state convention in Pennsylvania. Those Democratic legislators who joined with the Republican majority in passing the bills condemned by the platform are left to their immediate constituents for the "infliction of political punishment."

This part of the platform was not satisfactory to ex-Congressman William H. Snowden, of Allentown, and other delegates and before the convention met at noon they threatened to offer more drastic resolutions as a substitute.

Judge Harmon Yerkes, of Doylestown, was the only avowed candidate for Supreme Court Judge, and his nomination was conceded.

To Represent Oregon.

SALEM, Aug. 14.—Governor Geer has been requested to appoint delegates to represent Oregon at the National Farmers' Congress to be held at Sioux Falls, S. D., October 1 to 10, 1901. The provisions of the constitution of the National Farmers' Congress relative to delegates are as follows:

"The membership of this congress shall consist of one delegate for each Congressional district and two at large for each state and territory, and one for each Agricultural College and Experiment Station, to be appointed by their Governors, and one to be chosen by each National or state society, created and maintained to foster an agricultural interest in the United States.

"The Governors of the several states and territories may appoint such a number of associate delegates as to them may seem wise."

Associate delegates have all the privileges of delegates, except that of voting. Governor Geer will be pleased to hear from any persons who are interested in the congress and who will attend as delegates from this state.

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Fighting Force of 28,000 Men.

NEW YORK, Aug. 15.—According to the latest bulletin of the Colombian insurrection, a copy of which has just been received here, the rebels have a fighting strength of 28,000 men, distributed as follows: At San Cristobal, under the direct command of General Uribe-Uribe, 10,000; northern part of the department of Magdalena, under General Clodomiro Castillo, 1500 men; southern part of Magdalena, under General Jose M. Castillo, 2000; Province of Ocaña, (San Tander), under General Ardila 2000; in the town of Chita, Department of Boyaca, under General Rafael Camacho, 2000; Department of Tolima, under General Martin, 4000; southern part of the department of Cauca, near the Ecuadorian frontier, under Generals B. Herrera and A. Rosas 4000, in the Isthmus of Panama, in separate regiments, which will unite soon under command on one chief, 2500.

\$25,000 in Currency May Be Burned.

CHICAGO, Aug. 15.—Twenty-five thousand dollars in bills will be publicly burned by order of the Probate Court unless a clause in the will of Paul Scott, which was filed with Judge Hutter, is knocked out by the courts, says a Fairbault, Minn., correspondent of the Record-Herald. Scott who was 82 years old, left an estate of \$50,000, half of which is in bank notes and United States currency. The object of the will is supposed to be to deprive his legal heirs—three in number—of any share in this money. The heirs have protested on the ground that the administrator has not more right to destroy money by fire than he would have to destroy buildings. They will make a bitter fight in the courts against the carrying out of the terms of the will.
