**THE SULTAN BREAKS FAITH**

France Suddenly Severs All Diplomatic Relations With Turkey—Direct Personal Promises to Pay Disputed Claims Have Been Utterly Disregarded.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Aug. 21.—The French Ambassador, M. Constans, has notified the sultan's first secretary, that all diplomatic relations between France and Turkey are broken off and that the ambassador has informed his government to this effect.

M. Constans communicated direct with the sultan because the latest negotiations were transacted with the sultan personally. The ambassador justifies his action on the ground that the sultan broke his direct, personal promise, given to M. Constans at an audience in the Yildiz Palace Thursday regarding the purchase of the quays and the settlement of the disputed French claims.

The foreign minister also gave formal assurances that the agreement would be carried out, so, in view of this breach of faith, M. Constans holds that it is impossible for France to continue diplomatic relations with Turkey.

**Fame For Portland.**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—According to a bulletin made public by the census office today Portland is the second healthiest city in the United States, its death rate in 1900 being but 9.5 per cent, while that of St. Joseph, Mo., the leading city, was 9.1 per cent. The number of deaths in Portland last year was but 856. The Washington cities do not show up so well. The death rate of Seattle was 11.1 per cent; Tacoma, 11.3 per cent, and Spokane, 13.9 per cent. But 3396 deaths were reported in Oregon in 1900 and 4910 in Washington.

The bulletin gives the mortality statistics during the census year in the states and territories and the principal registration cities. The total number of deaths reported for the year was 1,039,004, as against 841,419 for 1890. Perhaps the most important feature of the results presented is found in the decrease in the general death rate in the registration areas of 1.8 per 1000 population, a decrease of nearly 10 per cent. The average age at death in 1890 was 31.1 years; in 1900 it was 35.2 years.

**Over Two and a Half Millions.**  
ASTORIA, Aug. 21.—Notwithstanding the many obstacles encountered by the packers, the value of the salmon canned on the Columbia River during the season just closed and of that handled by the cold storage concerns is far above the average of that of all the years since the enterprise has been extensively carried on here. This year's pack was 254,500 cases, while the cold storage handled 2700 tons. The market value of all the fish handled this season is \$2,573,800.

The estimate of the pack here given, which is generally conceded by packers to be correct, is based on 49 one pound cans to the case. Flats bring \$1.65, tins \$1.50 and halves 95 cents a dozen. Using these figures as a basis of calculation, the value of the canned salmon for the present season is \$1,628,800.

**Work of Deputy Fish Wardens.**

ASTORIA, Aug. 21.—Several letters were received at the Master Fish Warden's office today from the deputies in different parts of the state, and all speak of an encouraging outlook for securing large numbers of eggs at the various stations. Thomas Brown, who is in charge of the work at Boulder Creek, states that he has secured 900,000 eggs and expects to get at least 500,000 more. H. A. Webster, in charge of the upper station on the Umpqua, writes that after two months' work he has everything in readiness to take care of the salmon when they arrive, but at the time he wrote the spawning season had not commenced. W. C. Brown, writing from Salmon River under date of August 15th, says he expects to secure all the eggs there that the hatchery can handle.

**Ninety-Two Bushels of Oats to the Acre**

M'COY, Aug. 20.—E. E. Robbins has just finished threshing a field of fifteen acres of Clydeedale Spring oats that yielded 1380 bushels, or an average of 92 bushels per acre. They are a plump, white oat, grow tall, and have a good, stiff straw, which keeps them from falling. The grain weighs 44 pounds per bushel from the machine. Mr. Robbins imported the grain from England two years ago at a cost of \$2.50 per bushel, and it weighed 50 pounds per bushel at that time, but was extra well cleaned.
