

THE COLLEGE BRED-MAN.

"What good does a college education ever do a man?" is a question often asked, especially by those who have been unfortunate enough not to have had the advantage. The answer is simple enough, says the W. W. Union: It does everything for him. It makes him a man, if he has had the natural mental capacity to grasp the opportunities held out to him. If not, college or anything else would not succeed. We have all heard men say that a fellow goes to college for is to learn how to play football, throw a hammer or row a racing-shell. This may be a part of the collegiate career, but it is the foundation of practical study. Of course, if the student does nothing but train he is bound to fail in his lessons, but take the man who leaves with a diploma, a degree and a big bunch of muscle, and he is in pretty good condition to begin the more serious battle of life.

It may be that Latin, Greek and calculus are not used very much in ordinary business careers, but neither is the muscle. What he is taught these things for is to broaden out his intellect—they are dumb bells to the brain. A college education puts a finishing touch to the young man that can never be acquired in any other way. He enters a raw, untaught youth; he comes out a polished, intellectual man. He is fitted to begin his later career with every advantage at hand. His mind has been trained to study not only books but conditions, and he is able to grasp situations with all the greater alacrity. This is a general conclusion. All young men are not alike, but, taking a general average it is safe to assume the college-bred man has a vastly better opportunity to attain ultimate success than the boy who left school after he had finished the eighth grade.

The mistakes of the few, the ungentlemanly acts of a small band of students here and there may have unjustly made more impression upon the general public than the polite, manly young fellows who constitute the large majority of our college graduates, the young man who has the opportunity to go to college and does not, makes the error of life.

Each of these influences has doubtless been at work, but it is an established fact that the decrease in consumption during the past three years means neither that an equivalent of at least 200,000 smokers have ceased to use paper cigarettes, or a larger number are more moderate in their use.

The main causes of the decline in the use of cigarettes were mentioned some months ago in The Telegram. They are two: first, business men will not employ cigarette-smoking men; second, respectable young women will not "go" with such young men.

You see a girl smiling and chatting with a young male person who is in the meantime rolling and lighting a cigarette, and you need no prophet or clairvoyant to pencil in words or other outlines that girl's future.

True, many good people make a cigarette occasionally, or even habitually, in moderation, but a boy or

youth who is a "cigarette fiend" is properly ostracized by both business men and decent society.—Telegram.
