Good Price For Apples.

Hood River, Aug. 29.--D. H. Sears, of this place, made a sale yesterday of a carload of Ben Davis apples, of 4555 per box, delivered on board the cars at the Hood River depot. The carload of 500 boxes brought \$8000 cash, and were bought by J. N. Carroll, a merchant of Dawson City, Alaska. The apples will be gathered and shipped at once in order that they may reach the Klondike market before the winter freeze sets in. Immediately after Mr. Sears made the sale of this carload at \$1.80 a box, a Chicago buyer appeared and asked him to set a price on the remainder of his crop, some pine of Ben carloads.

Fourty Cars of Potatoes.

Stockton, Cal., Aug. 29.--A special train of about forty carloads of potatoes will leave here today for the Middle and Southern States. The potatoes were raised on the other islands west of this city and towed here on barges. The demand for potatoes, onions and cabbage throughout the Middle States is large, owing to the drought, and hundreds of carloads will be sent there from Stockton this year. Local dealers are paying from \$1.50 to \$1.70 a hundred pounds for potatoes, on the river bank. Today's shipment is the largest single consignment of potatoes ever sent out of the state.
