

LABOR DAY LESSONS.

Exceptional interest attaches to the observance this year of Labor day. The pending conflict between the Amalgamated association and the steel trust, and extensive labor strikes in various cities, together with recent injunctions issued from federal courts, are indicative of a crisis.

In a number of cases federal judges have issued injunctions which verge upon a dangerous interference with the personal rights of American citizens. Strikers are enjoined from conversing, in any manner, with non-union employes who have taken their places. Years ago the laws and public sentiment drew a clear line beyond which striking wage earners were forbidden to pass—namely, violent interference with workmen who accepted employment that had been rejected by the strikers.

Until within recent years, the right of moral suasion was not challenged by any court, and that right seemed secured to all parties in interest. The employer had the right to persuade other workers to take the place of strikers, and the strikers had the right to persuade, by lawful methods, the same men not to take the places which they had left.

But recent injunctions have advanced a new doctrine. The right of the employer to persuade men to take places rejected by others is maintained, but the right of the strikers to persuade the same men to refuse such employment is denied. Unless the temper of the American people is misunderstood, this doctrine will not thrive in American soil. It is a noxious plant which can not endure the light of public inspection Spokesman-Review.
