

**TEACHERS' INSTITUTE.**

More Teachers Arriving and Renewed Interest Manifest.

Thursday's afternoon session opened with singing. This was followed by Superintendent J. S. Landers on the subject of "Music in the Public Schools." In brief he spoke of the great need of it; the need of developing all a child's faculties, as there are many powers in the mind which developed would lead to many reasonable results. All children can be taught to sing. There is a part of human nature that can only be reached by music. If the last germ of original thought is to end at thirty-three years of age, how emphatic it is that the development of the higher powers should begin in early life. The inspiring influence of music in putting down fear; influence upon the individual and nation.

Prof. French followed with a talk upon numbers. This was a continuation of his morning talk upon this subject, taking up the special subject of fractions. Build a basis from child's experience, then proceed from that to build, including the four fundamental operations. Continued repetition is his motto.

After a short intermission Supt. Gilbert reviewed a list of teachers who had already secured positions for the year. There are some nineteen schools yet vacant. All are very small schools.

Prof. W. C. Hawley occupied the rest of the afternoon session in a continuation of his talk upon history and civil government. In his discourse he brought forth the error of the democratic party in adopting "state rights," and held to view men in office who hold country above self, the purchase of Louisiana; the embargo acts and non-intercourse acts; the stimulation of the success achieved by privateers in 1812; the desire of the North for good commercial relations with England; effect of alien and sedition laws; importance of protective tariff and the importance of the "Monroe Doctrine."

**FRIDAY MORNING.**  
Cool and clouded. Attendance good. Session opened with song. Superintendent Gilbert made a few remarks, announcing the lecture of Prof. French to take place at the Congregational church tonight, at 8 o'clock, upon his "Tour Through Europe." Superintendent Gilbert also extended the time allowance to cover Saturday's session.

Prof. Hawley resumed his talk upon history and civil government. His discourse took up that time immediately preceding the civil war and during that period.

After a short recess Prof. French took the subject of geography. He called attention to the sources of material for teaching this subject. How teachers may be obtained and at what cost. It is his aim to bring real material before the pupil.

Prof. Hawley concluded his course of lectures upon "Physiology Psychology." He brought forth Aristotle's definition of the difference between the educated and uneducated as "the living and the dead," the value of education of the reflexes; the overcoming of the inertia of attention, for with this nothing can be sought.
