

THE COWARDLY YELLOW HYPOCRITES.

Under the above title the Globe-Democrat publishes the following extract from a recent sermon of Rev. Allen K. Smith, a pastor of St. Louis, Missouri:

"The cartoons of one paper which I call to mind, with its low-browed bestial giants, armed with clubs, and dominating the figure of president, vice-president and senator, have preached many an eloquent sermon to the poor, identifying the government with all the power of tyranny."

Commenting on this, the Globe-Democrat says:

"Of all papers in the United States the St. Louis Republic has been the filthiest in printing cartoons of this type, with editorials to match. It has put forth scores in which President McKinley was drawn as a rickety pygmy, with a crown on his head, and grinning abject obedience to one or more millionaires who towered over him and directed his movements. Sometimes the Republic made of the president a manikin seated on a throne, with a lop-sided crown on his head as if drunk, and the body swathed in imperial robes, while the plutocrat stood near to be the real ruler of the country. Every line of the 'artist' reeked with as malignant a hate as ever rankled in the heart of Czolgosz.

"On the morning of the assassination the San Francisco Examiner, one of the three papers owned by the proprietor of the New York Journal, and the accepted pattern of the Republic, had a cartoon representing President McKinley as a minstrel with blacked face singing a coon song deriding the common people. The next morning the Examiner announced the assassination with the remark that 'William McKinley is loved as an American citizen, an American soldier, a simple man devoted to the interests of the people.'"

In this connection it is interesting to quote the statement of Senator Dietrich, of Nebraska, as reported in an interview with an Oregonian representative a few days ago in Portland. Said Senator Dietrich: "It seems strange to me now, when I recall the closing speech of the campaign for President McKinley's re-election that I made in Lincoln, Neb., that I called the attention of the audience to the fact that his assassination, like that of Lincoln and Garfield, would be the logical outcome of the bitter attacks that were made upon him as an imperialist. I expressed the belief then that such bitter attacks that were made upon him by Bryanism and anarchism and by yellow journalism would result in so inflaming diseased minds that his death would be almost certain."

The Detroit Free Press has located the proper place for an international anarchist colony. The paper says it is only a question of time before the Bermuda islands will sink under the ocean. The geological theory is that the islands are merely the remnant of one large island. The subsidence within a comparatively recent period has been from 80 to 100 feet. The appropriateness of the Bermudas for the enterprise suggested will need no further illustration at our hands.

Pendleton is strictly in the swim for the governorship; that is to say in its mind's eye. It has two republican candidates, Judge Lowell and W. J. Furnish, and now the East Oregonian announces that George Hartman is "mentioned" by his friends for the nomination on the democratic ticket. Pendleton evidently believes with the East Oregonian that "it rests with Eastern Oregon to take the nomination for

governor by merely uniting sentiment."

Walla Walla has sold an issue of refunding bonds which bear 4 per cent interest. The bonds which are to be taken up by the new issue bore 6 per cent.

Marion county is out of debt and has \$2000 in the treasury more than is needed to pay off all outstanding warrants.

A. S. McDonald, formerly superintendent of the schools of Linn county, has bought the Wasco News.
