

TO HONOR M'KINLEY.

Nearly every observing man and woman in America has noticed the fact that the hands on dummy clocks in front of jewelry stores in all parts of the country point to the hour of 3:15. This was the hour when President Lincoln was attacked by Wilkes Booth in Ford's theater in Washington, D. C., April 14, 1865. Just look at one of the dummies on the public street and see if this is not true.

Now it is proposed to make a change in these silent time pieces, and instead of marking the hour of the assault upon Abraham Lincoln to change the hour to 3:55, when Czolgoz made his infamous attack upon William McKinley, the third martyr president of the United States.
