

MEN OF THE PEOPLE.

The republican party has suffered more from the assassination of its leaders called to the highest station than any other ever formed, says the Globe-Democrat. Concluding Race Yesterday Afternoon.

The second heat of the trotting race between Edmund S., Freak and Dennis, which was not pulled off in time for yesterday's issue, was a complete surprise to everyone. Edmund S. apparently won the first heat without much exertion. Freak took the lead in the first round and easily held that position to the finish, while Judd Fish's Dennis went to the front at a surprising rate and took an easy second from Edmund S. Time 2:46.

The third heat was almost as surprising as the second, and in this Dennis showed that he was a speedier horse than was anticipated and won the heat in 2:44 1/2, which was the fastest time of any of the heats. Edmund S. followed about a length behind, with Freak third.

This heat was followed by the most amusing feature of the afternoon, it being the novelty race under saddle. It consisted of a half-mile walk, half-mile trot and half-mile run, the horses taking part being Wm. Buffington's Mayflower, T. J. Dripps' two horses, Volto and Daisy, A. Wise's Whistler, and F. S. Fleming's Slocum. Daisy won by about an eight of a mile, with Slocum second and Mayflower third.

The trotters were once more brought on and in this, the final heat, gave a splendid exhibition. Dennis took the lead and held it throughout the entire race with apparent ease, while Edmund S. and Freak had a close contest for second money, which was won by the former. This gave Dennis first money and Edmund S. second, the time of the concluding heat being 2:44 1/2.

The next feature of the afternoon was one of the finest ever seen in the district, it being an exhibition of Hippodrome, or Roman stand-up riding. It was done by E. D. Wallace, champion Hippodrome rider of the world. He stood on the backs of two horses and made a circuit of the track at full speed. Wallace is certainly a wonder, and his exhibition was well received.

The concluding race was the half-mile

dash between Speculation, K. C., B. C. Green and Eddie M., and would have been a pretty race if it were not for the fact that the race was thrown off by B. C. Green's jockey, who held the horse back for reasons better known to himself. It was won by K. C., with B. C. Green second. The jockey was immediately summoned to the judge's stand, and in spite of his protest of innocence the bets were declared off and it is likely that he will be taught a lesson by the judges that he will not soon forget.

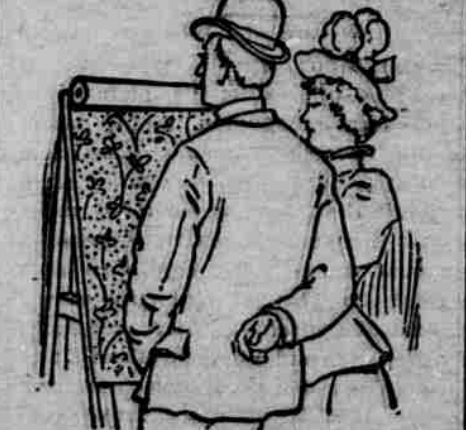
