McKinley's Last Words.

At a large meeting of Ohioans held in Washington a few days ago to pay a last public tribute to the memory of their dead congressman, governor and president, an interesting feature was the reading of a letter from Dr. M. D. Mann, one of the president's physicians, to M. Sullivan, secretary of the Ohio Republican Association. The letter reads as follows:

BUFFALO, N. Y., Sept. 6, 1901.—T. M. Sullivan, Esq.: My Dear Sir—As President McKinley was dying I stood behind a screen in his room and heard him say his last words. His wife came into the room and he said to her: "Good-by, all; good by. It is God's way. His will be done, not ours."

There was some further conversation with his wife in the way of leave taking, but this should not be repeated.

About an hour later he said to his wife: "Nearer, my God, to Thee, 'e'en though it be a cross, 'has been my constant prayer."

He tried to say something more, but I could not catch it. I gave out at the time the first sentence as being the most appropriate to be remembered as his last words. I wrote them down at the time, so that there can be no question about it. Yours very truly, M. D. MANN.

An Impressive Incident.

George Kunkle, who was in Chicago at the time of the funeral of the late President McKinley, was an eye witness to the scenes along the parade on that day, and in a letter to his sister gives the following description:

"The McKinley parade was the grandest exhibition of loyalty and sympathy that I have ever witnessed. It was thoroughly military. At 2:30 o'clock every piece of machinery in Chicago stopped, surface cars, elevated, and even railroads, everything creating any noise at all. Chicago never in its history was quieter than in those five minutes. The first band in the parade had just passed me and at a sound from the cymbals the whole parade became motionless. All the men removed their hats and at least 10,000 bare heads could be seen. A little later the band began to play the hymn 'Nearer My God to Thee,' and it was taken up by the crowd and sung with such feeling that when it was finished many men, and many more women, and even young folks not more than 12 years old were weeping. It was a very impressive scene and one that will live as long as live lasts with all who witnessed it.—Glacier.

Anarchist Will Be Deported.

ROME, Oct. 10.—Glavinovich, the anarchist arrested recently, a short time after his arrival from Dalmatia, he having been heard to threaten the lives of the Pope and of Cardinal Rampolla, pontifical secretary of state, has been sentenced to a fortnight's imprisonment for carrying deadly weapons, and then to be deported to his home in Dalmatia.

Should Restrict Immigration.

NEW YORK, Oct. 10.—Resolutions against the reckless admittance of undesirable immigrants to the United States were adopted yesterday at a largely attended meeting of the merchants' and manufacturers' board of trade of New York. In the resolutions it is stated that our standing abroad as a law-abiding people is injured by immigrants imbued with the idea that it is proper to assassinate presidents. President Roosevelt is urged to give the matter attention in his messages to congress. It was resolved that no immigrant should be allowed to land in this country without the production of a proper certificate from a United States consul, giving sufficient information to enable the immigration officials to pass intelligently upon the expediency of granting the privilege of residence in the United States.
