See Program For Crescus.

TOLEDO, Ohio, Oct. 12.—George H. Ketcham, trainer and driver of Crescus, made the following statement today: "I have taken off thirty pounds since the first of May and if I could get to 185 pounds I would drive Crescus in two minutes. I will take the horse to Columbus Monday and will try to reduce his record next week on the track. I will take him from Columbus to Kansas City and will visit Minneapolis, St. Louis, Pueblo, Denver, Salt Lake, Sacramento, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Las Vegas, El Paso, Albuquerque and the city of Mexico, which will make a very pleasant and profitable trip. I shall not consider the offer to exhibit Crescus on the vaudeville stage, as he is booked solid until the stud season will open."

May Send New Demand.

NEW YORK, Oct. 12.—Concerning the case of Miss Stone, the kidnaped missionary, the Constantinople correspondent of the Journal and Advertiser cables: "People versed in bandit tactics presume that the band, being well informed, have fled owing to the publicity given to the conditions of ransom, and expect the brigands will shortly send a new demand from some unexpected quarter. Nobody fears that Miss Stone's life is at present endangered, as the brigands desire ransom, and will not resort to extreme measures unless compelled by pursuit. The American officials will not divulge the plan of action they have arranged, but admit their intense anxiety."

Change Their Base.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 12.—Since the brigands who abducted Miss Stone were located on the mountain of Gultepe, the approach of the troops induced them to change their location. They are now hiding on the Turko-Bulgarian frontier, ready to cross to either side as circumstances demand. The decision to suspend the movements of the troops was partially due to the operating in the mountainous country, and partly owing to fear that a further advance might endanger the life of Miss Stone, hence the Americans desire to try and secure ransom. It is hoped this will result in the release of Miss Stone in a few days.

Discovered in Time.

FOREST GROVE, Oct. 12.—Forest Grove came near having a disastrous conflagration Thursday evening, just after turning on the electric lights. One of the clerks in the department store of Caples & Co., was called to the clothing department in the third story, when he discovered that a 32-candle-power lamp, which was used in that department to be carried about the room, consequently had a long cord attachment, had fallen between two large stacks of clothing, the same being almost ignited to a blaze. The fire was soon extinguished, without the aid of the fire department. The damages were only \$25. An early discovery was the only thing that saved the best building and one of the largest stocks in our city.

Europe's Shortage in Wheat.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—The department of agriculture has given out the following statement, prepared in the office of the statistician of the department:

Next to the wheat crop in Russia that of France is the largest in Europe. The yield of 1901 is: Wheat, 304,210,065; maalin, 8,890,140; rye, 63,805,877. The deficit of wheat is 21,872,549 bushels, in comparison with last year's 9,384,518 bushels in comparison with the ten year average.

Boat in the Fool Killer.

NIAGARA FALLS, N. Y., Oct. 12.—Peter Nielsen of Chicago, successfully navigated the whirlpool rapids this afternoon in a twenty-one foot cigar-shaped boat called the Fool Killer. Today's trip through the whirlpool rapids was witnessed by 15,000 persons. The Fool Killer passed through the rapids in four minutes.
