Summary of Assessment Boll for 1901.

The following is a summary of the tax toll of Wasco county for the year 1901 as finally equalized by the county board of equalization. For the sake of comparison a like summary for the year 1900 is also printed. It will be seen that the value of taxable property is increased over last year to the amount of over thirty per cent or \$937,976. Assessor Schmidt informs us that a large proportion of this increase is from property that escaped taxation last year. He says his aim has been not to much to increase the value of taxabie property as first, to find all the property subject to taxation, and, secondly, to equalize values so that each taxpayer would bear his just proportion of the public burdens.
