New Tax Law.

Taxes paid on or before March 15th Blakeley's drug store. succeeding the date of the levy will be allowed a rebate of three per cent, provided that the rolls reach the sheriff prior to that date.

Taxes become delinquent after the first Monday in April and there will be added immediately thereto a penalty of ten per cent and also interest at the rate of twelve per cent per annum in addition to the penalty.
