# MENEFFEE & PARKINS

A Dalles Girl in the Philippines.

Under date of September 20th Miss Ruth Cooper, one of the teachers sent by the government to the Philippine Islands a few months ago, writes to her family in this city an interesting account of her experience in her new home, and through the courtesy of Miss Cooper's father THE CHRONICLE is permitted to copy part of the letter. Miss Cooper and a Miss Mitchell have been assigned to a school in San Bernardino de la Union, a picturesque little town on the sea shore in Northern Luzon. They arrived there by steamer from Manila on the 12th of September, and after landing they were met by the native president, who took them to the native governor's office, where they were introduced with all the form and display peculiar to that people. After a luncheon with the army officers of the place one of the officers escorted the young ladies to their future residence, which Miss Cooper characteristically describes as "the dearest little bamboo four-roomed cottage in the world," and naively adds: "You would just keep up upon your toes and die laughing to see us sliding around

here on our kimonos over these bamboo floors." "We have," says Miss Cooper, "a Chino cook and a muchaco to run errands, etc. So far our cook is a jewel and the muchaco nearly kills himself to serve us. Servant hire is very cheap here, and absolutely indispensable in this hot climate. You would die laughing to hear us try to tell these fellows what to do. They know very little English and we know only about half a dozen Spanish words, so we go through all the signs and grimaces imaginable, much to the pleasure of our servants. We taught them how to wash, American, yesterday. The native way is to beat the clothes on flat rocks, and our American dresses will stand about one washing that way. Our school house is an immense one room bamboo building, with hard wood tables and bamboo benches for furniture. We are to have a new building soon and until that is finished Miss Mitchell and I teach only the girls and only two hours a day, from 2 to 4 in the afternoon. Our cottage is just across the street from the plaza, where the band plays two hours every day, and the school house is hard by. They are now erecting a scaffold in the center of the plaza, where there is to be a public hanging on the 1st.

Our next door neighbors (Mestizo—half Spanish and half Filipino) keep a little canteen, and there was a wedding there last night and today. They commenced about 8 o'clock last night and it is now almost 10 a. m. and the joy is still unconfined. Their music is a piano and an orchestra. They make pretty music, too, but there is such a thing as having too much of a good thing. This is a holiday on account of the president's funeral. The services in the plaza were most beautiful and impressive. All of the troops were assembled, and to the most beautiful funeral music the flag was lowered and draped in black. Isn't the death of the president something terrible? Is it possible that such a grand man had to be taken in that way? How can it be explained? We get mail from Manila every day or so and have direct communication by wire. This place I think in time will be the place of all Luzon. When we get our ice plant and electric lights, I cannot think of any place more delightful, unless it be Honolulu. You would be amazed to see how well I stand the heat. It really isn't half as bad as I expected. I was glad to get away from Manila, though, for that climate isn't half so nice as this."

### Three Tons of Gold.

PORT TOWNSEND, Wash., Oct. 24.—The steamship Portland arrived here at 1:30 this morning, bringing 520 passengers and three tons of gold, most of which came down the Yukon to St. Michael. The passengers arriving report that winter has practically set in, and that ice has begun to form along the shore at St. Michael. At Nome, the scenes around the transportation company's offices are most exciting. Hundreds of people congregate, all seeking transportation, and accommodations on steamers due to sail is not near sufficient for the demand. The Portland reports that nothing was seen of the Garonne up to October 11th, the day she sailed, and the Senator had not arrived. The schooner Abbie M. Deering sailed for Puget Sound October 10th. The revenue cutter Bear sailed from Dutch Harbor for Port Townsend October 14th, and the Manning and the Thetis will remain north until November 1st. The Portland had a rough passage down, and owing to the crowded condition, there was much complaint from the passengers.

### Skeleton of a Brontosaurus.

LARAMIE, Wyo., Oct. 23.—Professor C. W. Gilmore, in the employ of the Carnegie Museum, of Pittsburgh, has discovered, near Medicine Bow, eighty miles west of this place, the almost complete fossil remains of an immense brontosaurus, a very rare specimen, and one of the largest ever found in the Southern Wyoming field. The remains will be unearthed and sent to Pittsburgh.

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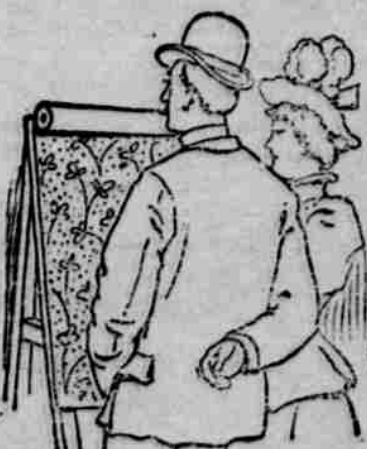
