Balloonists Landed Safely.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 3.—The nine occupants of the car of the balloon which escaped from this city yesterday afternoon returned safely today.

Those who made the involuntary trip were: Ed P. Dudley, the aeronaut; A. L. Dodge, Ed Foster, Jr., Walter Leon, C. P. Viddecoq, J. A. Leonard, M. L. Howarth, John A. M. Swift and Mrs. J. P. Gunsaulus.

When the balloon broke its bonds it sailed away in a southerly direction. South of Redwood City it struck another air current which took it towards the ocean over the summit of the Coast Range.

Nine miles from Lahonda and about six miles from Pescadero lies Beatty Thompson's place.

Thompson was up and out when the balloon came along by Wurr's mill, the grappling hooks slipping through the trees and raking along brushy patches of ground.

By this time much of the gas had been let out of the balloon and the power was weak.

The rope that had snapped and caused the captive to run away was sweeping along the ground, and when it came within Thompson's reach he grasped it and bore down with all his weight.

This stopped the flight. Soon the balloon was brought to the ground, and the overjoyed passengers and the aeronaut alighted and took supper with Thompson.
