CITY COUNCIL MEETING.

Messrs. Joseph Worsley and Charles Dietzel Elected Councilmen.

The regular monthly meeting of the city council was held at the usual place, with Mayor Farley presiding and all councilmen present at roll call, except Mr. Kelly, who arrived later.

After the approval of the minutes of the last meeting, which was done with some slight changes, the marshal was instructed to notify Mrs. W. Lord in regard to the bad condition of the sidewalk between Ben Wilson's saloon and Farley & Frank's harness shop, with orders to have the same repaired. It was also ordered that the marshal have all buildings and obstruction removed from the streets of The Dalles.

A petition from the Wasco Warehouse Milling Company asking for an extension of time for six weeks in which to complete their plant, was granted.

The reports of the marshal and recorder were read and ordered placed on file; also that the officers' salaries be paid, as well as all bills approved by the finance committee.

The recorder was instructed by the finance committee to make out an itemized bill in the Jack Allision account. It was also moved and seconded that the recorder draw a warrant for \$89.50 in payment of assessment of the Court street sewer.

The matter of election of councilmen in the First and Second wards, Joe Worsley being nominated was duly elected as councilman for the First ward, while Chas. Dietzel and N. Whelston were nominated for councilman in the Second ward. Mr. Dietzel received the majority of the votes and was declared elected. The recorder was instructed to officially notify these gentlemen of their election.

Stabbed by Highbinders.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 4.—Leong Kee, the 18-year-old wife of Ching Kee, a prominent Chinese merchant, was stabbed by masked highbinders late last night as she was entering her home upon her return from a social call on the wife of Chinese Minister Wu Ting Fang and the family of Consul-General Ho Yow, at the consulate. This is the first blood shed directly attributable to the long-standing feud between the Wong and Chin families, and fear is openly expressed in Chinatown that many lives may be sacrificed before it is settled.

Mrs. Kee, who belongs to the Wong family, though severely wounded, will recover. The would-be assassin escaped.

Many Venezuelans Drowned.

MARICAIBO, Venezuela, Saturday, Nov. 2.—Advices received here from Rubioa, dated October 28th say that a night attack of the Colombians has caused a general reorganization of the Venezuelan plan of defense. The Venezuelans were caught crossing a river near Rubioa. The rope bridge broke and numbers of Venezuelans were drowned. General Uribe-Urbe's force, which was on the extreme left, has reinforced the center. The general is entrenching.

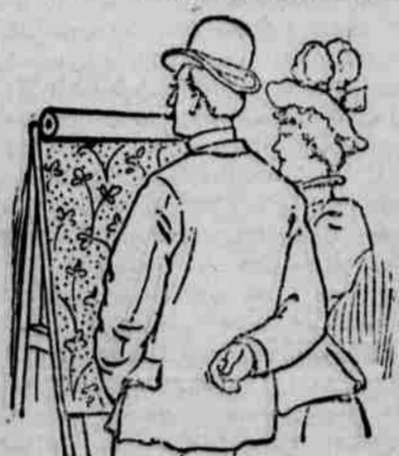
