Results of Election in a Nutshell.

Seth Low, fus., elected mayor of New York by 29,864 Shepard, dem., carried only a single borough.

W. T. Jerome, fus., elected district attorney of New York county by 15,000.

All fusionist nominees for justices of supreme court in New York county elected. Van Wyck runs nearly 30,000 behind his associates.

Democrats elected only one of the sixteen members of the board of estimate and apportionment of Greater New York.

New York assembly of 1922 will stand republicans and fusionists, 108; democrats, 42.

Buffalo, Syracuse, Albany and Troy elected republican mayors. Both parties claim Rochester, with probabilities in favor of republicans.

Croker says he will now stay in New York and continue Tammany leadership. Nash re-elected governor of Ohio by 85,000. Senator Foraker's re-election is certain.

Baltimore republicans elected their entire city ticket, but the Maryland legislature will be democratic by a narrow margin.

Schmitz, union labor, elected mayor of San Francisco by 4109. Union labor also elected three supervisors.

San Francisco republicans elected auditor, sheriff, tax collector, treasurer, county clerk, public administrator and six supervisors. Democrats elected city attorney, recorder, district attorney, coroner, two police judges and nine supervisors.

Republicans will probably carry Pennsylvania by 70,000 to 80,000.

Anti-Quay ticket in Philadelphia defeated by 35,000.

W. Murray Crane elected governor of Massachusetts for the third time. Legislature will be strongly republican.

Democrats carried Arapahoe county, Colorado; republicans Pueblo, Leadville and Colorado Springs.

Iowa republicans elected Cummins governor by 90,000.

Rhode Island and Connecticut scored republican victories.

Democrats increase their majority in Kentucky legislature and elect mayor of Louisville.

Republicans generally successful in Kansas local elections.

New Jersey elected republican governor by 14,000. Legislature republican in both branches.

Republicans of Nebraska elected their ticket by 7000.

Republicans of Utah victorious and South Dakota probably elected eight republican circuit judges.

Virginia democrats elected state ticket by 25,000 majority.

Wasco County's Public Schools.

The public schools of Wasco county are keeping pace with the increased population and financial growth now going on. The settlements in the timber belts west of Kingsley and south of Wamic have petitioned the district boundary board for new school districts within the past year, and the same have been granted.

It is said that all the land available between Bakeoven and Sherar's Bridge has been homesteaded. Here is a school district containing nearly eleven townships, which will eventually be divided into several districts. School in this district is now in session at Salt Springs instead of at Bakeoven as formerly, and Miss Bessie Underhill, of Boyd, is the teacher.

Shaniko has recently completed a two-room school building at a cost of \$1700, mostly raised by subscription. But one room is now being used and there is an attendance of thirty-seven children under Miss Elva J. Smith teacher.

The Antelope school is progressing nicely under the principalship of Miss A. May Sechler, with Misses Goodno and Spink as assistants. A good-sized class is pursuing ninth grade studies.

Harmony district, six miles west of Kingsley, has built the best one-room school building in the county and furnished it in modern style. J. M. O'Brien will teach there the present year.

Hood River now has a corps of six teachers, with a total enrollment of over 300 pupils.

Meaning of "Improved Minstrelsy."

Many times, says Mr. Henry, I am asked what improved minstrelsy means, and as there is much more significance to the term than is generally supposed, I beg to offer the following information:

In improved minstrelsy we aim to remedy the weak places, bald spots as it were. For example, the musical taste of the amusement public having rapidly developed in the last few years, we must come forward to meet it. The regulation vocal quartet must give way to the full chorus, necessitating three or four times the original number of singers. The rapid development in the field of military band music also requires that the up-to-date manager keep abreast of the times, hence necessitating more than double the number of skilled musicians formerly necessary, or in fact even now presented by organizations that play upon the public through an accidental favoritism. In improved minstrelsy the old, one man "star" system gives way to an all-around collection of bright, talented performers; just as the Frohman and Daly companies, of New York City, and the former Wallack company discarded the "star" plan for general all-around ability.

In improved minstrelsy, such as Hi Henry presents, no old traces of the past are permitted, but new material responds to new demands. The stuff club, the slap stick, the handful of flour, the fright wig, the shivering "haunted house," comedian and the "dummy" climax are all relegated to the rear.

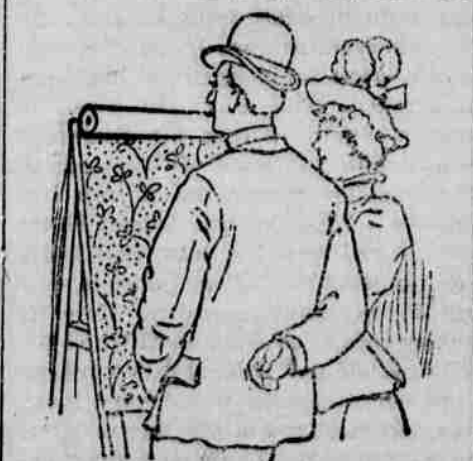
