HOPE TO CURE CONSUMPTION

Denver Business Men Establish an Outdoor Colony.

DENVER, Nov. 20 .- The Rocky Mountain Industrial Sanitarium organized by Denver professional and business men last spring, is now in successful operation. On a 10 agre tract five miles from Denver fifteen or twenty patients in the early stages of consumtion are under the plane of the promoters virtually taking care of themselves. The rules of the institution compel a continuous outdoor life to be maintained summer and winter. Each patient is provided with a roomy tent, plenty of warm clothing and blankets a small stove to be used only in extremely cold weather. Experience has proved that with proper food and clothing and a life in the open air and sunshine artificial heat is unnecessary and becomes absolutely unbearable to the patients, who without exception are gaining rapidly.

The hope of the physicians and others back of the enterprise is to form a great colony of all consumptives who come to Danver, and thus take them off the streets of the city, and out of the hotels and boarding-houses, where they could never requeer, and where they are a con-stant menace to the public health.
