

CRUSHED TO DEATH.

A Rock-Slide at Crates Point Kills One Man and Wounds Another.

A rock-slide occurred on the new railroad track at Crates Point yesterday afternoon which killed one man outright and mangled the leg of another so badly that it is doubtful if the member can be saved. Both men were strangers here and both belonged to the working force of Contractor Smith at what is known as camp No. 1. The man with the broken leg had the wounded member dressed by Dr. Logan yesterday morning and was sent to St. Vincent's hospital this morning.

Coroner Butts held an inquest on the body of the dead man this morning. It was found that his name was Jerry Lynch; that he was aged about 35 years, but whether married or single no one of his fellow-workmen seemed to know. Lynch came to his death by a rock falling on him, which weighed about two tons, and which crushed his head and groin and mangled one of his legs below the knee. He and another workman had examined the rock in question a short time previously—as it had rained heavily the preceding night—and they concluded it was safe to work below it.

In the pockets of the dead man were found the following bank certificates of deposit: One on the First National bank of Storm Lake, Iowa, for \$491.67; another one on the same bank for \$658.41; one on the First National bank of Hoquiam, Wash., for \$143; one on the First National bank of Centralia, Wash., for \$30. On this last there was an endorsement of \$10. There was another certificate of deposit on the National Bank of Commerce of Seattle, Wash., for \$60; one on the Canadian Bank of Commerce of Seattle for \$200. These make a total of \$1,572.48. Besides these was a note in the deceased's favor for \$106. The note is dated at Centralia, Wash., April 15, 1895. Also \$5.50 in coin, a silver watch and some other trinkets.

Not finding any letters on the man by which his relatives, if he has any, might be known, Undertaker Crandall telegraphed for information to the First National bank of Storm Lake, Iowa. The bank returned for answer that Lynch had a brother, James, in Vinton, Iowa. His brother has been communicated with and to him will be referred the disposition of the body.

The jury found, in addition to material facts just cited, that while Lynch "was working in a pit at the head of a steam shovel a slide of large rocks occurred in the wall of said pit which struck the said Jerry Lynch and buried him thereunder, crushing his head, groin and leg, from the effects of which the said Lynch died in about 10 minutes. That no person is to blame for the cause of the said Lynch's death."

The Dalles is to be congratulated upon the fact that she has living in her midst the talented young artist, Mamie Helen Flynn, and that through her efforts we are to have an opportunity to hear the famous artist, Rose Bloch-Bauer, soprano, and Reginald Hidden, violinist, who are to assist Miss Flynn in her recital at the Vogt Thursday evening.
