SHOULD BE RELEASED

Congressman Weeks Says Aguinaldo Is Now Harmless—Young Lady Teachers in Islands Ought to Be Sent Home.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 5.—Congressman Edgar Weeks, of Michigan, who arrived from Manila on the transport Hancock, when asked about conditions in the Philippines, said:

"I saw Aguinaldo and spent half a day with him. He is not an intelligent man, and I think he feels that he is inferior in intellect to the Americans. He seemed to me not clever, but cunning. The general opinion among the military men is that Aguinaldo should be allowed to escape. He is a dead issue and is no longer a menace to the United States. It is supposed that he does not want to run away, as he would at once be assassinated by the friends of General Luna, whom he ordered to be killed.

"The new method of educating the natives as adopted by this government is wrong. Refined, handsome young ladies from Vassar and other colleges went down to the Philippines to educate these natives. They have had to put up with all kinds of privations and to eat native food, and in some places their lives have been in danger. I think this is entirely unnecessary. In place of these young ladies discharged soldiers of education, who had become acclimated, should be appointed and the young ladies should be sent home.

"The question of the Saites of Sulu and his harem is a very small matter when you are confronted with the great questions that are now involved. The Sultan Saites, a married man, has been in the Philippines for some time, but he is a very insignificant individual. I do not see any trouble with him."

Dirty Charges Against Labor.

PARIS, Dec. 5.—An article in the Journal, published this morning, M. Labori, speaking in the interview in the Echo de Paris, denies that he wanted Despreux to poison his garden. Labori declares the conduct under which this pardon was granted and accepted and the silence which seems to have been

imposed on an innocent man, in whose behalf he, Labori, and others, in a passion for an ideal, had not hesitated to stir up the country.

Replying to the charge that he wanted to live off the affair, Labori declares that his connection with the case had cost him almost his entire practice, which only began to pick up again after the amnesty was granted, and against which, contrary to his own interests, he had unsuccessfully struggled.

The Sicile says that Dreyfus repudiated the Echo de Paris interview, which he neither directly nor indirectly inspired.

Scene After Anarchists

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—Practically the entire time of the senate today was devoted to the introduction of bills and resolutions. Two of these measures, relating to the suppression of anarchy and dealing with the anarchists, were allowed to lie on the table so that their authors, McComas, of Maryland, and West, of Missouri, may bring them to the early attention of the senate. The Isthmian Canal report was transmitted to the senate by the president, and several bills providing for the construction of the waterway, one of them by Morgan, who has led the movement for the canal in the past, were presented.

The True State of Affairs

New York, Dec. 4.—The Rev. Henry C. Haskell, D. D., superintendent of the American Mission at Ruzhitz, Bulgaria, has sent the following cablegram to the World regarding Miss Stone and Mame Telika:

"There has been no result as yet from our efforts to ascertain the truth about the reports that Miss Stone and Mame Telika are dead. It is denied that they are in the Rilo Monastery. I do not expect definite information for two or three days."

CHENOWETH STILL FOOLS OFFICERS

He Appears Occasionally in Echo Country—Preaches His Alleged Insane Doctrines and Then Disappears.

Echo, Dec. 5.—Mysteriously appearing at uncertain hours to promulgate his strange religious doctrines in the streets of Echo, Elwood Chenoweth, erstwhile Wallawa county lunatic in a sheriff's hands, and now wanderer on the face of the earth, has again revealed his location to the public. After disseminating his weird theories, Chenoweth disappears to some unknown retreat, for the officers of Umatilla county are on his trail. Has he friends?

Not for years has Umatilla county had so mysterious a case as that of "Wallawa El" Chenoweth. His first appearance was in Pendleton several weeks ago, where to curious groups on street corners he made known his beliefs. Arrested on an order from Union county for alleged theft, he was taken to that town, examined, and on the charge of insanity over to Union county's sheriff for commitment to the insane asylum at Salem. He went peacefully and apparently asleep to Nolin, eighteen miles west of Pendleton, when he suddenly sprang from the train and escaped over the Umatilla uplands.

For a week he was lost. Then he appeared in the little hamlet of Alba, on Camas prairie, forty miles south of Pendleton, where he resumed his mission of preaching to the people. Moving on to Ukiah, he was arrested by officials there on order from Sheriff Blakely, at Pendleton. As the sheriff was making preparations to start with him to Pendleton, Chenoweth made a second sensational escape, fleeing to the mountains. He sent back a "def" to the officers, outlining his intended route for them, and adding that in three nights he would preach in Portland. Then he was gone as strangely as if the earth had swallowed him.

Now he has appeared in the Echo country, still preaching to the people. Usually he comes in the afternoon and after a few hours goes away in a manner as peculiar as his coming. No man knows what he subsists on. He never stops anywhere for anything to eat, and it is known that he has no money to buy. Yet he always goes neat and tidy. Hence the question, "Has he friends, and who?"

The following story is going the rounds at the expense of J. P. Morgan: He was approached while in London by the representative of a great daily, to whom he sent word that his time was worth \$50 a minute. He received the answer that the newspaper man would take two minutes on those terms. "My curiosity was aroused," said Mr. Morgan, "and I gave orders to admit him. He gave me \$100 and talked for two minutes. When he arose I asked him why he had been so anxious to see me. He quietly answered that he had a lot of \$500 he could get to see me in his newspaper capacity."

Several years ago a number of Eastern railway nabobs got into a private car and were whirled over their line at the rate of 117 miles in 121 minutes and the story was heralded abroad through the country as a sample of fast running which it was. But the other night Jack Wright, an engineer on the Snake river line, pulling a train of passenger coaches and without any particular nabob on board, just to make up lost time, made 65 miles in 57 minutes. This seems to go the effect and one better.

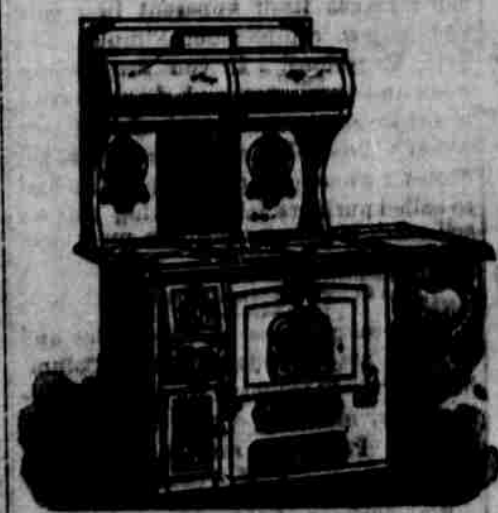
