### WAS STRICKEN WITH LOCKJAW

Mrs. Harry Hibbard Yawned and Was Unable to Close Her Mouth—Recovered After a Time.

WALLA WALLA, Dec. 15.—With her mouth open and her jaws locked Mrs. Harry Hibbard created a sensation last night at the dance given by the Sons of Veterans in their hall fronting on Alder street. The unfortunate woman threw her head back and opened her jaws to yawn. When she finished she found she could not close her teeth together and although her husband came to her assistance and forced her mouth shut, as soon as the pressure was released the jaw would fly open with a snap like a closing jack knife.

Realizing that the woman was stricken with lockjaw, the floor manager hurried her into a cab and she was at once driven to her home. Dr. Russell was summoned and at an early hour this morning the strain had released and Mrs. Hibbard was resting easily.

Lockjaw is a peculiar disease which is supposed to attack one only after a cut or bruise. Mrs. Hibbard claims not to have injured herself in any way and can give no reason for the sudden attack which robbed her of the power of releasing her lower jaw from the vice like clutch which held it rigid.

It is seldom that one stricken with lockjaw recovers, but Dr. Russell was early on the scene and was therefore able to afford almost instant relief. The sensation broke up the dance.

#### Mid Train Wreck.

HELENA, Mont., Dec. 15.—A spruce to the Independent from Kallispell says a wreck occurred on the Great Northern railroad near Essex, in the Rocky mountains, at 2 o'clock this morning. The engine, mail car and smoker remained on the track, but all the others were derailed. Some cars were overturned and all were more or less wrecked. The accident was due to the rails spreading.

#### Surprised the Men.

LONDON, Dec. 14.—Reporting to the war office from Pratoria, under date of

yesterday, Lord Kitchener says:

"Bruce Hamilton, after a long night march, surprised Piet Vrijen's laager at dawn, December 13th, at Watkrans, twenty-five miles northwest of Ermelo, killed 16 Boers and captured 76 armed prisoners. Many others were wounded and were left at farms. He also recaptured one of Benaou's guns, the other having been destroyed. Two field cornets were among the prisoners. The captured gun is in good order, and was used against the retreating enemy."

Right Hon. St. John Brodrick, secretary of state for war, wired the government's congratulations on General Bruce Hamilton's brilliant achievement.

Zero Temperatures and Big Blizzards.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14, 1:30 p. m.—The cold wave predicted by the weather bureau for the middle Mississippi and Missouri valleys and the upper lake region has spread to the eastward and southeastward as far as Chicago and St. Louis. At both places temperatures fell 54 degrees during the last twenty-four hours, reaching six below zero at Chicago and zero at St. Louis. The front of the cold wave today extends from Northern Illinois southwestwards to Arkansas. In all of this region temperature has fallen from 40 to 50 degrees in the last twenty-four hours. The cold wave promises to be severe during at least two days. It will extend eastward and southward, reaching the Atlantic coast districts by Sunday.

### COURT'S DECISION IN SCHLEY'S CASE

Benham and Ramsay Blame Hero of Santiago on Eleven Points; Dewey Exonerates Him.

New York, Dec. 14.—Captain Parker, of Admiral Schley's counsel, was told early this morning of the purport of the two Schley reports. He said:

"Admiral Dewey, better than any one else in the world, was qualified to judge in this case. He is the one man living, besides Admiral Schley, who conducted a campaign and fought a battle with modern ships, under modern conditions. He probably found there was a difference between theory and practice, and judged Schley in the light of his own experience."

The two other members of the court were high-minded men of the highest character, and men who would not misjudge knowingly or willingly. They never had the experience the admiral had, and probably did not see things in the same light as he did. We shall leave the matter to the judgment of the people of the country, confident that in the just popular mind, the findings of Admiral Dewey will be sustained."

Captain Parker reacted almost as much pleased that Admiral Dewey had sustained Rear-Admiral Schley as if the court had been unanimous in the verdict that he (Dewey) rendered.

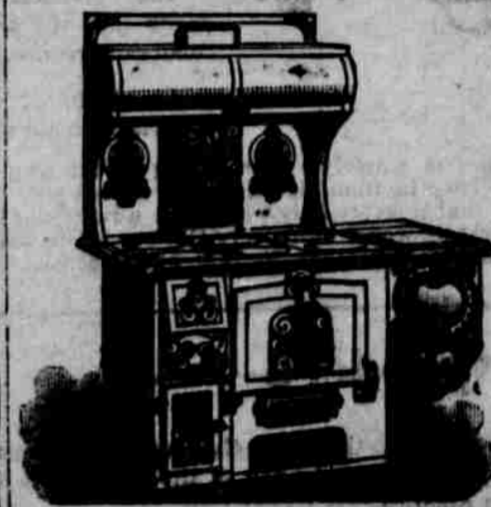
