WASHINGTON, May 18 .- Oregon will have much to do with the passage through congress of the Dyer act; now before a subcommittee of the senate judiciary committee, This bill deals with the incorporation of the United States trading companies for the purpose of doing business in China and grants them privileges under taxation law which enables them to compete with similar companies doing business in China financed by Belgian, French and English and manned by citizens of those countries.
