OREGON WATERPOWER CONSUMPTION SMALL

(Chronicle's Salem Bureau.) SALEM, Ore., May 27. (Special)-Records on file in the office of Percy A. Cupper, state engineer, show that not more than 5 percent, and probgon's water power possibility is actually developed and in use. The latest biennial report of the state engineer in general figures says it is estimated that Oregon streams, including those on the boundaries, are capable of producing between 3,000,000 and 4,000,000 borsepower, and that less than 200,000 has been developed, while the ultimate development of sites at which power is now being used in less than 500,000 horsepower.

Using specific figures, other records on tile in the engineer's office place the total horsepower at 3,441. 437. 


