

700 ATHLETES IN COLLEGE TOURNEY

29 COLLEGES HAVE ENTRIES IN HARVARD STADIUM CLASSIC.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., May 27.—The stars of the college athletic world—nearly 700 men whose names are high in the annals of field and track sports—gathered within the gray walls of Harvard's great stadium here today for honors in the 45th annual eastern inter-collegiate track and field championship.

Athletes from 29 colleges were entered.

California's team which came here a week ago to get acclimated has been training steadily and appeared in fine condition.

Out of the big entry list the names of Allan Woodring, Syracuse sprinter; Edward O. Gurdin, Harvard's crack negro flyer and Earl Thompson, Dartmouth's world's champion hurdler, stood out as the strongest contenders in their events.

In the century dash, Kirksey of Leland-Stanford and Woodring were picked to fight it out.

Langdon of Yale stood out as a strong favorite in the high jump. He will have Muller of California to reckon with, however, in addition to Brown of Dartmouth and Ramsey of Cornell. Muller recently jumped six feet 3 1/2 inches. In the mile run, Irish of Cornell and Campbell of Yale look the best.

Harvard men claimed that Ned Gourdin was unbeatable in the broad jump.

Raisey of Princeton was expected to make a good showing in the shot put. Majors of California and Teibert of Harvard are also competing in this event.

The two national champions entered are the Untine-Barge Club's senior centipede and the Penn Barge club's senior four.

Harvard, Princeton and Syracuse are expected to be among the collegiate entries.

The Navy eight, which broke the world's record at the Olympic games last summer and which gave the dope a job recently by losing to Princeton, is entered in the race for the Steward's challenge cup.

It was hoped that Princeton would enter the eight that defeated the Navy, but the athletic officials declined on the grounds that the Tiger rowing schedule was so heavy it would not permit of another big battle.

The Vesper Boat club plans to have five entries in the big events, one of which may be the eight stroked by Jack Kelly.

FIRST FOOTBALL GAME PLAYED FOR CANNON

DENVER, May 27.—A revolutionary war cannon was the prize for which Rutgers College and Princeton University first played organized inter-collegiate football in November, 1869, according to Homer D. Boughner of Denver, who was a member of the Princeton team.

There were no regulation uniforms in those days and there were 20 to 25 men on a team, as Boughner remembers. Holding the ball or running with it violated the rules as did holding or tripping of players.

Rutgers won the first game, six goals to four. The return game was won by Princeton, Nov. 13, 1869, eight goals to nothing. Boughner said. The deciding game was never played, the faculties of the schools believing the interest of the students over the games was detrimental to scholarship.

Later, Boughner said, Princeton won the cannon.

No admissions were charged to the games and the visiting team and rooters were royally entertained.

TRAINING METHODS OF FIGHTERS VARY

NEW YORK, May 27.—No two heavyweights for a championship ever trained under more widely different conditions than Jack Dempsey and Georges Carpentier.

Even down to the handling of sparring partners Dempsey and Carpentier do not agree.

Dempsey mauls them and beats them. Carpentier treats 'em gently. Dempsey hasn't been doing a lot of real training so far. Yet two of his human punching bags—Jack Clifford and Leo Houck—have pulled stakes. Larry Williams, a hard, is about to leave.

Dempsey claims he cannot get results when he pulls his punches in training bouts; that to get the correct timing and direction he must hit hard.

Carpentier claims he can get results without putting all his energy into a blow.

Gus Wilson, the Frenchman's trainer, says Carpentier has never had a sparring partner since he has been training him. Journee, the big Frenchman who is working out with the challenger, says the blows sting some times.

"Just as soon as Georges puts one over that hurts, he lets up a little bit," Journee said.
