The Dalles was in the lead, 5 to 0, for the first six innings of the game, and everything looked like clear sailing in the seventh canto, however, Woolsey, who was pitching for the locals, seemed to weaken, with the result that the Dufur swatters, fast on their feet from long practice in chasing jackrabbits, at once began circling the bases. When the dust had finally cleared away, four of The Dalles' rooters who had wagered on the local team were being carried from the field on stretchers.

The Dalles team is going to invade Dufur next Sunday, with the avowed intention of securing revenge. On the third and fourth of July, the local team will play two

games with the Condon team, at Condon.
