

TOWN AND COUNTY.

Proceedings of the County Court of Clatsop County, at the December Term, 1899.

Upon application of J. H. Fisk the assessments of J. H. Fisk, Clementine V. Fisk and Mrs. Elvira Woodward, for town property in Milwauki, were set aside, and the Sheriff directed to go upon the ground and re-assess the same.

On the application of George Clark his assessment was reduced eight hundred and fifty dollars, for the reason that he was absent from the county from March to November 1899, and he had been assessed for property which he did not have, and his indebtedness had not been deducted by the county assessor.

John Pankey, and other citizens petitioned for the establishment of a road, commencing at Pankey's farm and ending at Philip Foster's, and proof being made that notice had been given according to the requirements of law, the Court appointed George Currens, George Githens, and Samuel Raney viewers, to view and report upon the necessity and practicability of such road.

On application of Isaac Frost his assessment was reduced \$1,650.00 for indebtedness not deducted by the county assessor. John P. Purdie and other citizens, petitioned for the establishment of a road, beginning at Spring Creek bridge, near Woody Post-office, and ending at Wilson's farm, on Butte Creek, and proof being made that legal notice had been given, the Court appointed Joseph Johnson, Robert Sconce and James Struthers, viewers to view and report upon the necessity and practicability of such road.

Citizens petitioned for the establishment of a road leading from Lyman William's land claim to and intersecting a road from E. Leveney's place to Oregon City. And proof being made that legal notice had been given the court appointed James F. Chilwood, Samuel Gilliland and Samuel Embree viewers, to view and report upon the necessity and practicability of such road.

Ordered that Dr. F. Barclay be, and hereby is authorized to expend \$5 per week for the benefit of the O'Reilly family, until the further order of this court.

Mrs. O'Reilly is the woman whose leg was broken at Wilson's Circus last fall. She has not yet recovered, and the family being poor and the husband being most of the time engaged in taking care of his wife, the court, upon application for relief, made this appropriation. And Dr. Barclay being her physician was properly selected as the person to secure what was necessary for the family.—En.

On application of George Marshall his assessment was reduced \$7,220.00 for indebtedness not deducted by the County Assessor. The viewers, heretofore appointed to view and report upon the necessity and practicability of a road beginning at Glad Tidings P.O., and ending at Wilhoit's Soda Springs, reported in favor of the establishment of such road. But the report was rejected because it had not been made according to law, and John Wilhoit, one of the petitioners, was taxed with the cost of the survey.
