Five ounces and a half of their blood were infused into the vein of each arm of the patient, the marked good effect of which was evinced in five minutes by a rallying of the pulse, and otherwise beginning reaction. No further discharge of blood from the original wound occurred, and in ten days the patient was able to walk about in the ward, and rapidly regained strength.

Whatever may be the termination of this case, regarded as one of a wound with complicated sympstoms, there can be no question of the entire success of the operation of transfusion, and of its saving the medical savants of this country. 


