In the matter of the application of D. H. Good for reimbursement for alleged loss on County orders, it is adjudged and ordered by the Court that the said D. H. Good has received all money to which he is entitled.

The report of the viewers of the road leading from Harding's Precinct to Milwaukie, being irregular, the Court allowed the viewers to amend their report, and return it into this Court at the next regular term thereof.

Ordered, that the proposed road heretofore viewed, leading from Glad Tidings to Westport to Willott's Soda Springs, be established as a public road.

J. W. White, Supervisor of Road District No. 32, having failed to report at this term of Court, according to the requirements of law, it is ordered that a citation issue to the said J. W. White to appear and report at the next term of this Court.

In the matter of the petition of Jesse V. Bone for the construction of a bridge across a ditch near the ferry, the consideration thereof was postponed to the next term of this Court.

Ordered, that a new Road District No. 55, be, and hereby is, created in the vicinity of Cuttings' Mill.
