Death of a Prominent Citizen of Tennessee.

Maj. Richard F. Cooke died of paralysis at his home, in Putnam county, on the 15th of October, 1870, in the 84th year of his age.

He was one of the pioneers of Tennessee, was an officer under Gen. Jackson in the war of 1812, was for several terms a member of the State Senate, and was for the organization of the State to within the past ten years, when stricken with blindness, one of the leading citizens of his section of the State.

His ancestors came from Scotland. His father was a Marylander, and brought up in the South Carolina, from which State he moved to Tennessee, and settled in what was known as Jackson county.

He was the father of two of our principle wholesale merchants, Col. Watson M. Cooke, of Cooke, Settle & Co., and Bolivar H. Cooke, of B. H. Cooke & Co.
