DEATH OF S. T. CHURCH.—Mr. C. P. Church, of this city, last Monday, received a dispatch from Santa Clara, Cal., announcing the sad intelligence that S. T. Church, well and favorably known by many in Oregon, had died at that place last Monday. He had been in California some time ago to seek a more favorable climate for his failing health, but his constitution had been too far destroyed to find relief, and his health began to fail very rapidly after he arrived at Santa Clara. There were few men in Oregon who were more universally esteemed than Mr. Church, and many a warm friend will mourn his death. His remains will be brought to Salem by the first opportunity. His wife was with him at the time of his death, having gone down about a month since. Peace to his ashes.
