In pursuance of a call for the purpose of ascertaining the sense of the people of Oregon City as to the feasibility of having a celebration of the 4th of July, on the ninety fifth anniversary of American Independence, at Oregon City, Oregon. The following were among the proceedings had: Col. W. L. White was chosen to the chair; G. E. Warren was chosen Secretary, and on motion the following committee was chosen to superintend the arrangement of said celebration: A. Noltner, T. Charman, John Myers, C. E. Warren, A. C. Bailey, J. L. Barlow, Geo. E. Plume, and W. L. White.

At a meeting held by the General Committee on the 1st instant the following were appointed committee on finance: A. C. Bailey, John Myers, Rodney Tompkins and T. Apperson.

The General Committee upon motion adjourned to wait for report from Finance Committee, and met June 22d, A. Noltner in the chair.

Finance Committee reported favorable, Thos. Charman, as Treasurer of the Committee thereupon a motion was made and carried to celebrate the 4th of July, 1851, at Oregon City, Oregon.
