Spirits of Ammonia - A Useful Article for Many Domestic Purposes.

Few house keepers are aware of the uses of Spirits of Ammonia for many domestic occasions. It is cheap, easily attainable and saves a deal of labor in some cases. For taking grease spots from

fine fabrics rub the spirits of ammonia on it nearly pure and then apply a bit of white blotting paper and iron it slightly.

To wash laces put 15 to 20 drops in a quart or more of hot suds. and the operation will be quick and satisfactory.

To clean silver, put two teaspoonsful of ammonia in a quart of hot suds, and use a nail brush. To wash paint, put a tablespoon-




