

Extract from the Speech of General Morgan of Ohio.

AN APPEAL TO YOUNG MEN.
Gen. Morgan, of Ohio, delivered the opening speech of the campaign at St. Clairsville, Ohio, on Tuesday, June 27. It was an exhaustive review of the misdeeds of Radicalism, in which he furnished the figures to sustain his facts and the official record for every statement. His conclusion was an appeal to young men, which he applied to this State, as well as Ohio.

"Before concluding, fellow citizens, I wish to have a few words of friendly counsel with the young men who have come to age since the delirium of 1861, swept over our land in 1861. Young men, a great responsibility is upon you! In a little while your fathers will pass away, and the guardianship of liberty will be yours. Then prepare to perform your duty by studying well the grave questions of the day. Many of you were boys from eleven to fifteen years of age when the great Confederate war began, and all that you heard then and much that you have heard since, has been calculated to impress upon your minds the idea that the Federal Government—the Union, as we love to call it—was older than the States—in fact, was the creator of the States. The contrary is true. The States had an independent sovereign existence before the Union was formed. Indeed, the very word Union signifies the combination of what before existed separately. The States were independent governments. They agreed to form a united or general government for certain purposes which they specified in a written constitution. They, the States, conferred upon the Union, in writing, certain powers of a general character to be used for the general benefit of the whole people, and for the entire Union. And all the political powers not thus delegated were retained by the States or the people. The States form the bulwark of the liberty of the citizen. It is States which protect your lives and property. It is the State court which vindicates you, when your rights have been violated by a neighbor. It is the Federal court that drags you to Cincinnati or Cleveland if a tax spy charges you with having violated the excise law. When you marry it is under the law of your State, and when you are blessed with children, they are educated under the State laws. The States preserve the Union despite all the blunders of the Federal Administration. Had this been a centralized government, it would have been rent as by the shock of an earthquake and two distinct nationalities would have been formed. Whence came the soldiers who fought our battles? From the States. By whom were they organized and officered? By the States. When panic reigned at Washington, whence came the high words of hope and courage to re-man those who were about to abandon the capital of the Republic? From the States. Had there been no States then, we would have no country worthy of being called a country now. It was the existence of the States, the vitality of the States, which saved us from the horrible calamity which has afflicted France—anarchy, to be followed by despotism.

"My brave young friends, this country is your heritage—protect its institutions, for they alone stand between you and serfdom. Mr. Sumner promises you an imperial empire. To create an empire out of free States is to make slaves out of freemen. Are you ready to cover in the dust like whipped spaniels and call such men on horseback masters? Grant and the bad men around him intend to subvert your liberties! Already he has sent armed columns of regular troops to New York and Philadelphia to interfere in the elections. At his own request he has been clothed with greater power than is possessed by the Queen of England or the Emperor of Germany. At his mere will he can close your courts, proclaim martial law, suspend the writ of habeas corpus and take possession of the ballot box. During the last session of Congress a bill was nearly passed authorizing the President to call out volunteers. Volunteers to what? To arm one portion of the people against the other. By the mad stupidity of party to smother patriotism, and with the hands of freemen strangle liberty.

You say "Grant achieved great victories." So he did, and I would not dim one ray of glory won for him by the courage of our soldiers. "Grant is brave." So was Caesar. Grant is simple in his manners. The tyrant Caligula gained his name by wearing the coarse shoes of his private soldiers, and Tiberius and Nero were regarded as friends of the people until they got astride the shoulders of Rome, when the Devil, who was concealed in their hearts, unmasked his deformity. Young men arise to duty! Your liberties are in peril! Morton and Butler are confidential advisers of the President! Will you follow their lead? Do you wish to perpetuate their power? If not, unite with us in the slogan of Reform! Let us demand equality of rights, and equality of burdens! Let us appeal to the people, and save our country by driving the oppressor and plunderer from power.

A short time ago a close-fisted farmer on Sandy river, in Maine, died, after devising \$1 to his only son. The old gentleman was duly buried in the venerable churchyard, which suffered a terrible washing away by the late flood, and a short time ago his body was found opposite his son's place, having been brought down the river a long distance. When the tender-hearted son was informed of the fact, he made the touching remark: "Probably come back after that dollar!"

Three fourths of the difficulties and miseries of men come from the fact, that most men want wealth without earning it, fame without deserving it, popularity without temperance, respect without virtue, happiness without holiness.
