Many I. W. W. Withdraw Pleas of Not Guilty

CHICAGO, Jan. 3.—George F. Vanderveer, attorney for the 196 alleged members of the I. W. W. appeared in Judge Landis' court today, when the cases of the alleged conspirators were called and withdrew their pleas of not guilty. In place of these pleas, he substituted motions for bills of particulars in the cases of 57 of the men, bills of denunciation for eighty-three and pleas in abatement for twenty-three of the indicted men.

THE motion for a bill of particulars, if allowed, will force the district attorney to prepare a list of specific charges against every defendant in whose behalf the motion was filed. The motion for denunciation will force the government to submit the indictments to a searching test in the hope that flaws will be found to show their illegality. In the pleas for abatement the defense will try to establish that the indictments named the men charged as members of the I. W. W. which the attorney contends is not a fact.
