sion being the unveiling of a tablet and the unfurling of a service flag in honor of the young men of the church who have gone into the service of their country. And this service is to be combined with a farewell to Dr. Carl Gregg Doney, president of Willamette university, who is under appointment to go to France. Dr. Doney virtually has decided to go, but the date of his departure is uncertain.

The board of trustees of Willamette university, at the request of the national army Y. M. C. A., headquarters of New York, granted Dr. Doney six months leave to go to France and study and organize army Y. M. C. A. work.

The tablet which is to be unveiled Sunday night is presented by the official board of the church and contains sixty-eight names, a three-star flag, presented by the Ladies Aid Society, will have seventy-two stars.

LIGHT THROWN ON NEW ORDER

Public Service Commission Issues Letter to Shippers of Oregon

Elucidation of the meaning of Order No. 3, by Director General McAdoo is given in a letter to Oregon shippers that has been sent out by the public service commission. The order has been acquiesced in by the Oregon commission and will be effective on and after January 21, 1918.

The letter from the commission to the shippers follows: "That there may be no question as to the practical application of demurrage charges under Order No. 3, of W. G. McAdoo, director general of railroads of date January 5, 1918, we would advise shippers that such order has been acquiesced in by this commission and will be effective as to all carriers by rail in Oregon on or after January 21, 1918.

"The charges applied by this order (after 48-hour free time limit) are \$3 for first day, \$4 for second day and for each additional succeeding day \$1 in excess of that for the preceding day until a maximum charge of \$10 shall be reached on the eighth day of detention beyond free time limit, thereafter to be \$10 per car per day.

"A more forceful example of demurrage charges under the director general's order is contained in the following illustration: Suppose a car to have been detained ten days over free time. The charges will be \$72 whereas under the rules of this commission not effective after January 21, 1918, the charge is \$37. "Shippers will recognize that the increase in demurrage charge is for no other purpose than to discourage holding cars longer than is abso-

lutely essential and to encourage shippers to provide more extensive facilities for speedy release of equipment. This commission has pledged its cooperation to the director general and in turn asks the sincere cooperation of all shippers that the intent and purposes of the demurrage order and its consequent beneficial results upon shipping may be consummated and that Oregon may take the lead in this as it has in many other patriotic movements."

Enemy Scheme to Send Out Poison Pollen Denied

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 17.—Agricultural experts of the University of California have characterized as "absurd" tonight a reported enemy plot to destroy the wheat crop of the United States by the dissemination in this country of a destructive pollen said to have been shipped from Germany.

The state council of defense today announced that it was in receipt of reliable information from Washington that a quantity of the so-called pollen already was in the hands of German agents in California. The council called upon the authorities for a tracing of the substance. "The very nature of wheat," said one of the university experts, "would make such a scheme impossible. Even if the wheat could be impregnated it would not be destroyed."

Benton County Schools Have Official Journal

The Benton County Teachers' Bulletin, Volume I, number 1, an eight-page folder published by the county school superintendent, R. E. Cannon, was received at the office of Superintendent of Public Instruction J. A. Churchill, yesterday. The bulletin is an official publica-

tion for the teachers of Benton county. Its purpose is to give the details of all requests upon the schools from the federal government, such as the thrift campaign, the crop and labor survey, the Junior Red Cross, and whatever other calls that are made.

The publication will also give directly to the teachers the plans of the state and county departments of education for the school year. Most important among the items is one giving a complete outline of the war-savings stamp plan, and urging each teacher to present this plan

to the pupils of her school. Other articles of special interest to the teachers of Benton county found in the bulletin are those on spelling contests, club work, reading circle work, standardization of rural school and a good number of general items of news.
