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MITTEL-EUROPA SCHEME TALKED IN ALL GERMANY
Plan Would Develop Hamburg and Copenhagen by Russian Goods

MARKETS ARE OUTLINED
Central Europe Must Give Russia Output for Resources Is View

STOCKHOLM, Jan. 15.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press.)—A scheme for a gigantic German-Russian alliance to dominate Europe is being put forward in all parts of Germany by the advocates of the old "mittel-Europa" plan. The best summary of the new scheme which has yet appeared is published in a Swedish newspaper, the Gothenburg Tidningen from the pen of a German propagandist. He outlines the project as follows: "The future Central Europe-Russian 'block' among other aims, will have before it the mighty task of bringing the great riches of Russia into the world markets. For this purpose there are two natural windows on the west: one is Hamburg, the other Copenhagen. These two towns will become the great markets of the world. The produce of southern Russia will go by the Danube and Rhine-Rube waterways to Hamburg; the riches of Central and Northern Russia will go by the Dvina and Volga to the Baltic and Copenhagen. In this manner an interchange of produce and manufactures will be realized between Scandinavia, the Central European block, Russia, and the whole Mohammedan world. "The Germans have been given a friendly welcome by the Baltic people who hail them as liberators. Germany's occupation of this territory will have results that no peace conference can prevent. Germany has opened up prospects of a Northern Mediterranean, the waters of which are now under her control. Moreover, Germany's plans for actively still further north are being materially assisted by the increasing friendliness of the Finnish people. While Finnish socialists are fraternizing with Russian soldiers, Germany is winning the friendship of the middle classes and the peasants of Finland. "Germany, however, is meditating neither the incorporation of Finland in the German Empire nor any kind of political alliance. She would be delighted to see Finland united to Central Europe as part of the economic block, thus extending German economic power far to the north. "If Germany gains control of the Baltic and Finland becomes an independent state, joined by economic alliance with Central Europe, there will be no outlet for Russia west-

ward except through this economic alliance. Even the western powers cannot help Russia here. Yet Russia must do her utmost to retain for herself economic breathing space in the west. She cannot dispense with the powerful Central European block. It would hardly be to fight her own Russia to even try to fight her way even with the assistance of the Western Powers; the map shows this. Russia, once peace has been restored, will gradually incline herself to the Central European block. This will be in keeping with her natural economic development. "In order to recover, Russia must above all, procure an outlet and market for her important natural riches. With no free passage to the west, she will avail herself partly of the assistance of the central European block and partly of Scandinavia."

AID IS PLANNED FOR SOLDIERS
Bill Would Train Men Not Suited to Further Military Service

WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—Government machinery for the vocational rehabilitation of soldiers and sailors unfit for further military service would be made available under certain conditions to any persons injured in civil or federal employment under the terms of a bill approved by a conference of representatives of government departments and civilian organizations. The measure will be sent to Secretary Baker with the recommendation that it be presented to congress. This training would be under the control and direction of a board of vocational rehabilitation, composed of one representative each of the war, navy, treasury and labor departments and the federal board for vocational education, to be appointed by the president. Advisory committees to assist in the economic and social supervision of the work are provided for, one representing labor, one commerce and industry and one agriculture. The conference was called by Surgeon General Gorgas at the direction of Secretary Baker.

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CAMP LEWIS TO ORGANIZE TEAM
Leaguers to Play Baseball With National Army Men This Season
CAMP LEWIS, Tacoma, Jan. 19.—The Northwestern Baseball League may wash out of an odd number of clubs this coming season. The odd club will be unofficial, of course, and will be composed of a team representing the 9th division of the army. It is planned to have a team of the Northwestern Circuit visit here each Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday during the league season to play the camp nine. President Robert Biewett of the league and Captain F. C. Cook, camp athletic director, both favor the scheme. The game, however, would have no place in the standing of the clubs or the compilation of batting, pitching or fielding averages. They are merely intended to give the national army men some big league baseball and to give the 9th division tossers a chance to show what they can do against a regular league aggregation. The camp team is composed of such stars as Louis Gulsto, the American League first baseman, "Red" Oldham, formerly of the San Francisco Seals, Ted Millien, the Northwestern league center fielder, who is said to be "there" at least one million, and others. Credit for the idea is due to President Dugdale of the Seattle club, and Judge W. W. McCredie, holder of the Portland franchise in the Northwestern League.

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
