## Corn Market Undergoes Declines With Arrivals

CHICAGO, March 15 .- With arrivals continuing on a big scale, and with apparently unlimited quantities yet to come forward, the corn market today underwent new declines. Prices closed unsettled, 1-8 to 3-8c net lower, at \$1.27 3-4 for March and \$1.25 718 for Mav. Oats lost 1-2c to 1 3-8c and provisions 7 to 15 cents.

Favorable weather for the crop movement help to make corn traders focus their attention on the fact that receipts showed no falling off in volume, and that no slackening in the number of arrivals was in immediate, prospect. Meanwhile inquire from shippers here had nearly reached the vanishing point owing to the absence of ordinary outlets to

the east. Despite a temporary bulge due to covering of 600,000 bushels by a speculative short, oats were sharply lower most of the day. Bears had an advantage from reports that much increased acreage was being seeded. Provisions sympathized with weakness of grain and hogs.

# STOCK DEALING IS RESTRAINED

Railroad Shares Exert Pressure; Trading in Bonds Is Negligible

NEW YORK, March 15 .- Except for a few highly speculative issues. the stock list was under general restraint today, largely as a result of pressure exerted against railroad shares. Canadian Pacific was the chief feature in this respect, recording an extreme loss of 4 3-8 points in consequence of an order issued by the Dominion government which provides for special war taxes against the company's earnings.

Reading and affiliated coalers also relinquished a part of their recent advantage and other investments indicated the cautious attitude or indifference of traders, the movement in low-priced rails sub-

siding completely. Bethlehem, Crucible and Lackawanna steels were among the early active and strong stocks, together with American Can, Shippings, Oils and Leathers. United States Steel, in which dealings again dwindled

The activity of pools was most evident in Baldwin Locomotive, Industrial Alcohol, Malting preferred. and Sumatra Tobacco, where gains of two to four points were partly forfeited on realizing for profits. Coppers, New York Airbrake and minor miscellaneous issues yielded one to three points. Sales amounted to 335,000 shares.
