Pea Crop in Wisconsin May Be Lost Because of Oregon Corn Shortage

DISCRIMINATION FEARED

Baker Mill Owners Declare Spokane Getting 95 Per Cent Capacity

The loading capacity of the Baker White Pine Lumber company is 125 cars a month, but because of car shortage, the company made only 25 cars in February. The company has had only 25 per cent of its capacity since October and all other mills in the Baker district are in similar straits, while in the Spokane district the mills are receiving from 72 to 95 per cent of their capacity. Since the company is tendering to the public service a commission's representation in a plea for assistance, the Baker White Pine Lumber company, the Oregon Lumber company, the Stoddard Lumber company, the W. H. Eccles Lumber company, the George Palmer Lumber company, the Grand Ronde Lumber company and the Nibley Milmaugh Lumber company.

Gardiner says most of the mills have loaded out the bulk of their orders for local territory and for some western states, but that orders a year old are pending for middle and northern states and that New England must be forgotten entirely for a time. On shipments of boxes for Wisconsin depends the saving of the pea crop of that state.

New England Hill.

"Practically all of the mills have loaded out the bulk of their orders for local territory. Wyoming, Utah, and Idaho," says the letter. "We have used open cars of all kinds, and stock is practically exhausted of the class of stock which usually moves into these districts. We have left a great many old orders, some of them a year old, for points in Michigan, Iowa, Wisconsin and Northern Illinois. Also about 10 per cent going into New England states, which we have to take to England for wire."

"Practically no box cars going in to this district, and as Union Pacific system will not allow its stock cars to go off its line, business will again be at a standstill.

"The class of lumber left on hand is nearly all of the higher grade, being factory lumber, selects, cut sash and door stock and canning cases for June peas, which by the way, must be moved soon, or the June and July peas raised in Wisconsin will not be cared for.

"We urge upon you the positive necessity of some of that class of business especially."

0 "As you know, we have had only
25 per cent car supply since October,
8 and only lately have been getting
2 about 40 per cent supply. To give
5 you an exact figure will say that our
6 company should load 125 cars per
month and in February loaded twenty-five.

“New Liberty loan drive coming off in a few days. Our employees will not be able to buy any. The bonds that they did buy have been turned back to us, therefore we are not in a position to buy and our mill is exactly similar to all other mills in this district. The business houses in town have their winter dry goods, or a large portion of it, left on hand because the employees of the mills could not buy the usual amount. The
